A 34 THF flight (17 of VT-21, and 17 of Cardiv 22) and 36 SHD's made a two wave attack on the Jap forces on besieged Munda. The groups co-ordinated their attacks very well and the assigned targets were well

covered.

AA fire was concentrated on the North side of Bibilo Hill which was well covered with bombs.

One plane was slightly damaged with AA fire with no injuries to personnel.
