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What our school does...

- Anybody who works at our school will be checked by the Disclosure and Barring Service to ensure that they are safe to work with children.
- Our school has a designated safeguarding team, they are: Mrs Sarah Briggs and Mrs Helen Fenlon. They have had a lot of training to identify what to do if they have any concerns about any children in our school. They are also able to train other teachers in our school.
- Our school has a security system and has locks on all of the external doors. We also have locks on the doors of rooms containing important documents.
- Our school teaches us how to keep ourselves safe. Our lessons include: healthy eating, anti-bullying, online safety, road safety and how to report abuse/concerns if we are worried about our safety.

What our parents do...

Parents are the most important people to keep us safe. In order to keep us safe, they should...

- Talk to school if they need help or support.
- Let school know if their child has a medical condition or is off school sick.
- Let school know of any court orders.
- Let school know if there is any change in circumstances, such as: a house move, new contact details, change of name or a change of parental responsibility.
- Let school know who will be dropping off and picking up or of any additional changes to arrangements regarding their child.
- To read the school safeguarding policy.



What should I do...

If I am worried about something or have concerns, I should:

- Tell an adult I trust straight away.
- Report anything that worries me.
- Keep all messages for evidence.
- Don't keep worries to myself.
- Try to stay calm.
- Try to ignore the person.

What I should not do...

- Do not keep worries to myself.
- Try not to get worried or upset.
- Do not delete messages, block any unwanted messages, links or attachments.
- Do not be nasty or unkind back.
