



## Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2016 – 2017

### **Soccerstars**

Soccerstars have provided a lunchtime club for Key Stage 2 throughout the year.

Impact = 86% of children in Key stage 2 participated in one or more sessions.

### **Dance Club**

A Dance Club provided afterschool dance with a specific aim of engaging girls in physical activity. This club was also open to boys.

Impact = 56% of Key Stage 2 girls attended this club on a regular basis.

100% of these children performed at the Festive Afternoon where parents were invited to attend. They have also performed routines to the whole school.

### **Netball Club**

We provided afterschool netball sessions with the aim of engaging girls in competitive sports. The club was also open to boys.

Impact = 48% of girls participated regularly in the netball club.

A regular programme of matches against neighbouring schools exposed the girls to competitive sport.

### **Tri- Sports**

Sports Premium has been used to set up and run a small school multi-sport programme of competitive fixtures for children in Key Stage 2.

The indoor programme has included:

- Dodgeball
- Benchball
- Hockey

The outdoor programme has included:

- Football
- Tag rugby
- Netball
- Rounders
- Athletics
- Cricket

Impact = 58% of Trent children participated in at least one competitive event.

53% of Griffon children have participated in at least one competitive event.

Parents questionnaire indicates that:

100% of their children had benefitted from the programme and that their child would like to continue participating.

100% of parents said that their child had gained confidence in sporting activities.



## Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2016 – 2017

100% of parents said that their child has shown a greater interest in competitive sports since participating in the Tri-Sports programme.

Parents commented that the Tri-Sports programme had given their children the opportunity to compete against and befriend children from both Aston and Weston schools through regular contact.

Parents of former pupils commented that friendships forged through Tri-Sports competitions had continued into secondary school.

### **Forest School**

Justin Comasky attended a Forest School training week and outdoor first aid training. Trent children took part in Forest School sessions during the Summer Term.

Impact = 100% of children in years 3 and 4 accessed Forest School sessions.

### **Inter-School Sports**

In addition to the Tri-School Sports competition we have competed in a variety of inter-school competitions, including:

- hiring DW Sports Soccerdome for a football tournament with bus travel,
- Years 5 and 6 girls football fixtures,
- Year 5 Soccerstars football tournament at Derby University
- Years 1 and 2 athletics meeting.

### **Cycling**

Cycle Derby provided cycling proficiency training for children in Years 5 and 6.

Year 5 and 6 children participated in a track cycling day at Derby Velodrome.

### **Sports Week**

A full programme of sports was provided throughout the week, including:

- trip to Markeaton Challenge Academy for Key Stage 2 children,
- a trip to Clip 'n' Climb for Key Stage 1 children,
- a teambuilding competition,
- football tournaments,
- circuit training,
- a visit from Derby County mascot Rammie,
- a multi-sports tournament,
- TAG Rugby training,
- the Barrow Mile,
- Forest School sessions.
