For most of the parents and children, it was their first time to experience the river boat and it was all very exciting and enjoyable for them.














Lunch on the River



What have we learned

The children in our community need exposure to certain sites and places for them to contextualise what they learn in class

The exposure shapes the children's understanding in a way that is much more informative than if they only relied on classroom knowledge

The children discover a much wider world out there compared to what they are accustomed to in their immediate environment

What would you do differently next time

Some of the things that we would do differently are:

- Plan for smaller and much more manageable groups
- Reminding participants of time constraints and sticking to the scheduled times
- Planning smaller but multiple trips to the same places
