CACF funds non-invasive, research-supported therapies that treat the root causes of veterans' wounds — not just the symptoms. Our grant-supported modalities, including hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT), neurofeedback, vibroacoustic therapy (VAT), and photobiomodulation, are designed to restore the brain-body connection, reduce chronic pain, alleviate persistent neurological and psychological symptoms, and lower suicide risk. CACF may also provide financial assistance to veterans, their spouses, or accompanying family members to help offset travel and lodging expenses associated with accessing evidence-based therapeutic care.

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY: #1 INJURY OF U.S. ARMED FORCES

The Impact of TBI and PTS on Veterans: Traumatic brain injury and post-traumatic stress are the most prevalent injuries among U.S. veterans. The Defense and Veterans Brain Injury Center has documented 533,519 TBI cases from 2000 to Q3 2025 — 82% classified as mild concussions — often misdiagnosed due to no visible imaging findings. 2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- **Donations increase** — \$12,641 in 2024 to \$275,948 in 2025.
- **More than doubled veterans treated** — 26 veterans received therapy grants in 2025, up from 11 in 2024, with grant funding jumping 500% from \$13,500 to \$81,090
- **Music festival hit new highs** — festival revenue grew from \$235,515 to \$375,708. Drivers: ticket sales and sponsorships.

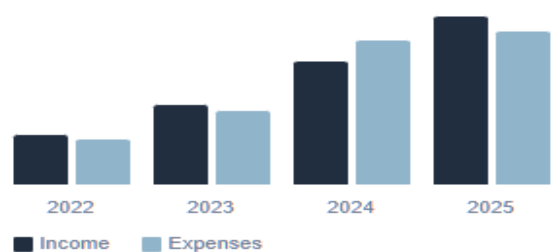

FESTIVAL GROWTH



The Veterans Band Aid Music Festival has grown from \$235K in revenue in 2024 to \$376K in 2025 — a 60% increase in a single year. Investment in production quality, performer talent, event infrastructure, and deepening sponsor relationships has built a strong and scalable foundation. With ticket sales doubling and sponsorships climbing to \$112K, 2025 marked the year the festival turned the corner — generating a net surplus that flows directly to veteran care.
