...about CASA Volunteers

- Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) volunteers are trained community members who give their time and experience to represent the best interests of the child in dependency, neglect, and abuse cases
- CASA volunteers are recognized and regulated by Kentucky statute (See KRS § 620.500-.550)
- CASA volunteers satisfy extensive screening and training requirements, including 30 hours of instruction
- CASA volunteers serve at the request of the Court
- CASA volunteers have only 1-2 cases at once

...about CASA Programs

- Local CASA programs in Kentucky are established by the Judge of the Family Court or if none, then the Chief District Judge (See KRS § 620.505)
- Local CASA programs cover 99 counties in Kentucky
- Local CASA programs are governed by a local board and managed by a director
- Local CASA programs train and supervise volunteers

Among a CASAs Duties:

- ☐ Visit the child regularly
- ☐ Interview relevant parties
- ☐ Monitor the child's home environment
- ☐ Participate in treatment planning conferences
- ☐ Attend hearings
- ☐ File Reports
- ☐ Help ensure the Court's Orders are being followed
- ☐ Stay engaged until the child is in a safe, permanent home
