The White Rose Trophy is one of the events at the annual Bowls England National Championships played across two days, Saturday 31st May and Sunday 1st June at Royston Bowls Club. This prestigious Under 24 event brought together the most promising young bowlers in a vital stage of their development pathway. For many, this is a springboard toward national recognition, with eight teams from each competition qualifying for the final stages at the Aviva National Bowls Finals in August.

Men's Captains Mid-Season Report (Paul Anderson)

County 2 Rink League:-

A difficult start in the league with the first five games producing two wins and three losses, however in each of the games lost a valuable point was gained for winning on one rink. With a little luck there could have been a better outcome.

We are now past the halfway stage in this competition needing three wins and a maximum of seven points in each of the remaining matches if we want to be near the top of the league.

East Beds Triples League:-

A-Team (Division 2)

So far five games played and have lost only once to current table toppers Maulden A (only by four shots). We are currently sitting top of the table with Maulden on 8 points, however they have a better shot difference.

The A-team won the first round of the Knock Out Cup against Maulden E. We play Sandy Con B in next round on 12th June.

The team won the preliminary round of the Champion of Champions Cup (qualified for entry by making the final last year), against Great Barford; we now await our second round opponents.

We started the season with only seven players but John Colby joined to make eight, however at present we are without Terry Blyth but we are still managing to fulfill all our games.

B-Team (Division 4)

So far played five games, won three and lost two, so currently sitting in fourth position in the table on the same points as second and third placed teams, so very tight. However with a poor shot difference we need to keep winning to achieve our objective of retaining our place in Division 4, after gaining promotion last year.

The team lost to Henlow C in the Knockout Cup but have the Champion of Champions Cup to come against Maulden E.

Our newest team in the East Beds League has had a tough start with one win from four, which was at home to Flitwick. However it is still early in the season with plenty of time to turn it around. There has been some tough opposition in the matches played so far with players from Division 1 dropping down into Division 6 to play for new teams in their club.

Once again friendly matches are very well supported this season. More often than not we were oversubscribed with members wishing to play. The results so far are summarised as follows:



bowlr Rink Management System



What is bowlr?

bowlr is in essence an app (software application) which provides the opportunity to manage the use of rinks on the green. With more members than in recent seasons entering County and National Competitions, as well as internal club competitions and friendly matches, **bowlr** enables us to maintain an online rinks/green diary that all members have access to without the need to visit the clubhouse.

bowlr can be accessed using a PC, tablet, laptop or mobile phone. Every member can login using their membership number and password. The diary is then available to book a rink for all competitions. Each day displays six rinks, divided into three sessions: 10:00 - 14:00, 14:00 - 18:00, 18:00 - 22:00 and rinks may be pre-booked in any available slots. Regular sessions such as green maintenance, friendlies and EBL fixtures are already pre-allocated.

Initially there were expected 'teething' problems but the system seems to be working reasonably well. Clearly some members are using it frequently and this is the best way to become familiar with how it works

In addition to rink bookings **bowlr** has a membership section, accessible to all members, listing the names and contact details of all members — invaluable for arranging competition dates prior to booking your rink or simply to get in touch with someone. The membership section also enables us to hold names and details for emergency contacts. There is an extensive 'Help' section on the app and we encourage you to loin and have a look around if you haven't already.
