

A lot! There has been a lot going on down at the post. Here is a run down!

Remodel Update:



The tuckpointing on the front of the building is done! A final coat of sealant is still needed but is slated for completion this summer. Both plaques have been removed and are being stored in the office waiting for the completion of their new home. New bricks were installed where the plaques once were and in the process members found an old copy of the Elburn

Herald from 1954! Elmer Gliddon donated and signed the paper and installed it behind the plaque when first installed! Seems he knew we would be behind there one day! The post did receive a matching funds grant worth approximately \$2500 for the tuckpoint project. The grant was provided through the village facade improvement program. Work has begun on additional closet space in the hallway behind the bar. This will enable us to secure our bar stock and give us some more storage for the building manager. Improved lighting and a new drop ceiling are also in the beginning stage of construction. Meanwhile, in the office, demo will resume as time allows.

April Draw Down: Dennis Richmond reports best year yet for the draw down. Headed this year by Steve Lindquist, Paul Gardner and John Reece, a record number of attendees enjoyed another fun event at the post. WOW! You say. What a hard-hitting article! Sr Vice is pushing magazine subscriptions. NO, he is not. Here is what you need to take away from this. 1)This publication is well worth the read! It is packed with important information without the fluff. 2) The post receives a complementary issue. 
