The American Legion and other veterans groups were formed by service members, for service members. Not as a big social club with similar interests but to address the concerns and needs of our veterans affected by the circumstances related to their service. Who better to understand the needs of our service members than our own!

"But the government or the VA has it covered." you may say. Well yes and no. Why do you think they "have it covered"? It is because of the efforts of The American Legion and groups like them that keep fighting for our veterans.

Veterans returning home from World War I, not politicians, realized that the troops were broken, scared, and traumatized. Families were also broken or shattered when loved ones returned home, unable to resume the life they once had. Those returning veterans, officers as well as enlisted, saw the need for a unified voice from our veterans, for our veterans. On March 15-17, 1919, The American Legion was created to be that voice. They were the first to petition congress to take care of our returning troops. On August 9, 1921, the U.S. Veterans Bureau was created, in what would someday become the VA. But it wasn't done with a single phone call or single letter. It was achieved through organization and the relentless lobbying of our members, millions strong. This is why number of memberships matter!

The American Legion created programs for our Veterans, such as, The GI Bill of Rights (1944), continuously advocating for accountability of our POW's, sponsoring independent studies on Agent Orange (1983), Persian Gulf Task Force (1995). Families are also cared for through programs like, Family Support Network and the National Emergency Fund. Our nation's youth benefit from programs like, American Legion Baseball, Boys State, Girls State and numerous scholarships. Patriotism is taught through the creation of the Flag Code (1923), teaching about flag etiquette and ceremonial observances for our Veterans and our deceased heroes. This is just a small sample of the American Legion and what we do.

When you are asked to join The American Legion, you are not being asked to drop everything you're doing and become a lobbyist. You are being invited to support those that are fighting for you and your brothers and sisters. A simple annual membership does so much more than you realize. The time will come when you can be more involved. But it all starts with a membership.

This, is why we exist. You, are the who! Now, is the when!

Hines VA Hospital offers COVID-19 vaccine to Veterans of all ages

HINES, III. – Hines VA Hospital is now offering the COVID-19 vaccine to Veterans of all ages. Approximately 35 percent of its enrollees have been vaccinated to date. If Veterans are interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccine at the main campus or one of its Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs), they should call to schedule an appointment at 708-202-2707 or 708-202-7000. Veterans need to be enrolled in health care at Hines or one of its six CBOCs to be eligible for the vaccine. However, to receive care in VA, enrollees must meet certain eligibility requirements under current law, which may include income limits.

"VA has done an exceptional job at offering a streamlined COVID-19 vaccination process for Veterans, and Hines is proud to help Veterans get closer to normal life," said Lorry Luscri, Hines VA Hospital COVID-19 vaccine coordinator. How do you enroll in VA Health Care?

• If you live in Kane County, call the Kane County Veterans Assistance Commission at 630-232-3552, Monday through Friday. We will screen you for eligibility and, if eligible, submit your application to Hines. Processing time ranges from 1 to 24 hours.

• If you live outside of Kane County, you can apply on this website: <u>https://www.va.gov/health-care/apply/application/introduction</u> or by calling your local County Veterans Assistance Commssion. Processing times can take up to one week.

Before calling or applying, have your DD-214 and last year's financial information available. Please be patient, call volumes have been extraordinary due to the vaccine. If no one answers, leave one voicemail and your call will be returned in the order it was received.
