POST HISTORY

One century ago, on May 6, 1920, Daniel Simpson Post 630 was chartered. Many of the 24 original members were active in the post for the remainder of their lives, serving not only their fellow veterans, but the community of Elburn. More recently, our newly-elected Post Commander, Dan Kolzow, asked that we consider the direction of Post 630. How can we improve in our mission to support veterans and our community? Could we explain to someone what Post 630 does? Where should we focus our efforts? How can we better support and communicate with our members?

While these questions were posed to the new officers, they merit consideration by all members. Many things have changed in the past 100 years, but the mission of the American Legion remains the same and its success "depends entirely on active membership, participation, and volunteerism. The organization belongs to the people it serves and the communities in which it thrives." (Legion.org)

From the Post Regular Meeting Minutes...

September 1963-Members discussed the Sons of the American Legion, a program of the American Legion that was being revitalized at the time. Founded in 1932, the SAL was created to "honor the service and sacrifice of Legionnaires." Membership was open to males of all ages whose parents or grandparents served in the military and were eligible for membership in the American Legion.

September 1965- Membership Dues were raised to \$4.50 per year.

May 1967-Norbert Lund was named post rep for Vice Commander of the Kane County Council.

Dec 1968- Legion member, Robert Larsen, commented "on the quality of a TV show he had seen with regards to the un-American aspect of some of the entertainers." After explanation, he expressed a desire to write a letter to the TV station on behalf of the Post, and the membership agreed that such a letter would express the mutual feelings of the Post members.

March 1969- The possibility of "borrowing some films on moon travel" to be shown at a future meeting was discussed. Documentary films of interest to the members were occasionally shown after post meetings. At other times, past basketball games of successful Legion or local teams were shown.

Jan 1970- Membership in the Legion was not just an opportunity to serve, but also the opportunity to socialize. Post Adjutant, Charles James, noted in the minutes that the meeting was "followed by refreshments in the form of playing cards and just plain old-fashioned 'bull sessions' such as we used to know during our service days." The August 1970 meeting began "with a steak fry and a plentiful amount of golden goodness." (Christina Murri; Post Historian)

SERVICE OFFICER'S PAGE:

All C&P Exam Locations Now Open

VA has partnered with specialized contract examiners to resume in-person Compensation & Pension (C&P) exams related to disability benefits at their designated contract facilities and not at VA medical facilities. Your local VA Medical Center (VAMC) will still conduct VA medical appointments and testing related to your health care. Specific safety requirements are still in place for Veterans' health. While specialty exams are only performed when it is safe, certain areas have allowed removal of personal protective equipment (PPE) in order to complete the appointment.

Final C&P exam location has reopened

Through a joint collaboration with VA contract medical examiners, VA has opened its final location in central Alabama to create a 100% re-opening of locations now scheduling in-person C&P exams for disability compensation claims.


