





Overall Project Description

The State of Minnesota has a long history of water management by local governments. **One Watershed, One Plan (1W1P)** is rooted in this history and in work initiated in 2011 by the Local Government Water Roundtable (Association of MN Counties, MN Association of Watershed Districts, and MN Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts). Roundtable members determined that it is in the public interest to manage groundwater and surface water resources from the perspective of watersheds to achieve protection, preservation, enhancement, and restoration of the state's valuable water resources. The Roundtable recommended that the local governments charged with water management should organize and develop focused implementation plans on a watershed scale.

The recommendation was followed by legislation for the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) to adopt methods to allow comprehensive plans, local water management plans, or watershed management plans to serve as substitutes for one another, or to be replaced with one comprehensive watershed management plan. The legislation also required BWSR to establish a suggested watershed boundary framework for these plans.

The **One Watershed, One Plan** vision is to align local planning and implementation with state strategies over a 10-year transition period into plans built largely around the state's major watersheds.

The Cottonwood-Middle Minnesota One Watershed, One Plan Project Partners (listed below) entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for Planning in December 2022 for this effort. Grant Administration is being provided by RCRCA with no local match required to the grant funds.

The Plan was approved by BWSR on January 22, 2025.
