## The American Legion Basic Training

The BASIC TRAINING course provides a pillar-by-pillar understanding of American Legion services, programs, and history. The mobile-friendly online training is available free for members of The American Legion, Sons of The American Legion, and the American Legion Auxiliary.

BASIC TRAINING is a five-part course offered under the American Legion training banner at [legion.org/basictraining](http://legion.org/basictraining). Core topics covered are History & Organization, Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth. Each core topic includes suggestions for how American Legion Family members can influence and strengthen their local communities.

Course graduates can download and print a certificate of completion and order a pin from Emblem Sales.
