Reflection

Happiness?

During his life, Jesus experienced poverty: not only the physical poverty of deprivation, but the poverty of standing alone against the crowd. He experienced hunger, not only physical hunger which demands food, but the hunger which can be satisfied only by doing what's right. Jesus had reason to cry and be sad, not only for the loss of a dear friend, but for the lost opportunities of His own people. He also expected rejection, betrayal and abandonment, accepting it all as part and parcel of His life which He had dedicated to His Father. He trusted that His Father would bless Him – God could the handle the poverty, the hunger, the tears, the rejection.

This isn't to say that we should all become poor, hungry, sad-faced or afflicted. Jesus is speaking, today, to those who have committed themselves to doing God's work here on earth and, in doing so, suffer hardship, while reaching out towards Heaven.

Happiness is the best gift God has given us, for it is sharing in God's own life. **GOD** *is* **LIFE**, **BEAUTY** and **FULLNESS**. **GOD** *is* **LOVE** and therefore **GOD** *is* **JOY**! To be happy, we must let go and abandon ourselves to God's love. For the secret of true happiness is **LOVE**.

One day, Jesus' friends asked Him: "Who are the really happy people?" What would you have said?...those who have lots of money and plenty to eat?...those who are important and can boss others around?..those who are strong and never get hurt?

Jesus surprised everyone by saying the opposite. The **really** happy people, He said, are the 'nobodies' of this world: the poor; the unimportant; the hungry; the heartbroken; the peaceful; the persecuted.
