Church now closed

As we are now in 'lockdown' the church building is now completely closed. Remember though that it is the building which is closed not the church. You are the church. Be open.

Care of the Sick and Dying

The current health emergency has led to radical changes in our hospitals. To protect staff and patients, new rules essentially prevent almost all visits to in-patients.

One side-effect of this is that priests will not have the same access to patients in hospitals they have always had up until now. In particular, patients with Covid-19 are strictly isolated even from their own families.

The Archbishop is anxious to provide, as far as possible, support to the sick and dying in these terrible circumstances. In recent days Pope Francis has approved a new decree which, during the current crisis, provides the option of a plenary indulgence (the remittance of all temporal punishment for sins forgiven) to those who cannot receive the Last Rites of the Church and the Archbishop wishes this to be widely known.

Live Streaming – Spiritual Communion

A number of you may be following live streaming Mass from either the Cathedral or some other church. Those who are will not be able to receive Christ sacramentally in Holy Communion. However, I am glad to tell you that you can receive the Lord spiritually in an act of Spiritual Communion through your desire to receive the Sacrament, through your prayer and your faith. Here is an Act of Spiritual Communion written by St Alphonsus Liguori, that people who for any reason cannot receive Holy Communion sacramentally are encouraged to say:

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
