The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ

Reflection: Weakness of Love is the Power of Love

Today, we enter the most sacred week of our Christian faith. We raise our palms with joy, echoing the cries of the people of Jerusalem: "Hosanna to the Son of David!" Yet, we are invited to walk with Jesus into the silence, betrayal, suffering, and death of the Passion. Jesus moved across towns and villages for three years, preaching, healing, forgiving, challenging systems, and lifting the broken. His words had power. His hands brought healing. His presence stirred hope. But from today, everything changes. On this Palm Sunday, Jesus, who has always been the actor, now becomes the one acted upon. He is now a star. He allows the people to tell him what they will. On this day, the people wish to praise him, eulogize him, and proclaim him King, a title that is rightfully his.

There is another aspect of humanity that has yet to resurface. Humans are weak and unstable beings. Easily swayed by circumstances, pressure, and fear. And yet, Christ understands this. He knows the depth of our inconstancy. Instead of condemning us, Christ embraces it. He does not turn away. He plunges deeper into the mystery of our brokenness. Jesus takes on the entirety of the anomaly of the human heart. Jesus allowed himself to experience the betrayal, denial, injustice, and cruelty hidden within us all.

We may ask: Why would Jesus allow this? Why not defend himself? Why did he not prove His power one last time? The answer lies in the nature of true love: to give oneself completely, even to the point of appearing weak, so that others may be saved. The cross is not just the measure of Christ's suffering. It is the measure of His love. It shows us a God who does not wait for us to be perfect, stable, or firm. He meets us in our weakness. He does not save us by overwhelming force, but by absorbing all that is broken within us and transforming us from within.

Let us walk with Jesus, not just in the triumph of Palm Sunday, but into the silence of Holy Thursday, the agony of Good Friday, and the glory of Easter Sunday. Only by walking this full journey do we uncover the mystery that the Weakness of Love, its willingness to be broken, is the Power of Love.
