Reflection: You are also an Intercessor

In today's first reading (Genesis 18:20–32), Abraham stands before the Lord, pleading not for himself, but for the people of Sodom. This is the role of an intercessor. A person who speaks on behalf of others before God. Abraham's boldness in prayer wasn't random. It was made possible by three key realities:

Abraham's Relationship with God: As we read earlier in Genesis 18:1–10a, Abraham had cultivated a personal and intimate relationship with the Lord. God visited him. God dined with him. Abraham was not just a servant of God. He was a friend of God. This relationship gave Abraham both the confidence and the humility to approach God, not with demands, but with reverent pleading.

Abraham's Awareness of the Role of Humans as Intercessors: Abraham understood that, as human beings, we are given the sacred privilege of interceding on behalf of others. God has entrusted us with the grace to stand in the gap for our brothers and sisters. In a world often focused on personal needs and self-preservation, Abraham teaches us the selflessness of prayer. Not just praying for ourselves, but carrying others in our hearts before the Lord. This is not just a calling for the select few, but a universal vocation. You and I are called to this task of mercy.

God's Compassion and Mercy for Sinners: Ultimately, Abraham's intercession rests on the character of God: a God slow to anger, rich in mercy, and abounding in steadfast love. Notice that God's yielding to Abraham's request is not merely about saving the righteous. After all, the righteous, Scripture tells us, are safe in God's hands (cf. Wisdom 3:1). But God's heart aches for the sinner. He is willing to "compromise" with Abraham, not because God changes, but because love always makes room for repentance. He desires not the death of the sinner, but that they turn and live (cf. Ezekiel 18:23).

This is the power of intercession. So let us remember who we are today. **We are intercessors.** Never say to yourself, "Who am I, that God would listen to me?" You are created in God's image and likeness. You are the apple of His eye (cf. Zechariah 2:8). You are not insignificant in His sight. He longs to hear your voice interceding for those who cannot or do not pray for themselves.
