Reflection: The Power of a Little Faith.

I have been deeply concerned for each of you after the strong winds that swept through our area, and I truly hope that you and your homes have remained safe. As further winds are expected, I urge us all to take good care, to watch out for one another, and to stay well prepared. We are fortunate when the weather can be forecasted in advance, giving us time to prepare. But what about the storms of life? The sudden illness, loss, disappointment, or conflict? These rarely give warnings. Even when we are cautioned, nothing truly prepares us for the weight of such storms. In these moments, many ask: Is God truly present, or is He an absentee landlord?

It was in such uncertainty that the disciples asked Jesus: "Increase our faith." (Luke 17:5). Jesus did not pour faith into them like water into an empty cup. He instead points to the power of the faith they already had. Even faith as small as a mustard seed can move mountains when exercised. Exercising faith means holding firm when the storm rages, refusing to let despair have the last word. It means recognizing the hand of God, not only in the calm after the storm, but even in the turbulence itself. To trust that God is still guiding us when we can barely see is itself an act of deep faith. As we rebuild our lives, recognising God's presence in the kindness of neighbours and in the encouragement of friends is itself an act of faith.

Faith matures in action. Just as muscles only grow when they are stretched and used, so too does faith grow stronger when it is lived out, especially in times of trial. The disciples longed for "more faith," but Jesus shows us that growth does not come through passive waiting. It comes through living the faith we already have. It is in prayers whispered in fear, a decision to forgive when it is painful, a word of hope offered to someone who is struggling. Over time, these experiences shape us into people who trust God more fully, no matter the storm.

So, Jesus boldly assures us: I have given you power to tread upon serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy (Luke 10:19). Divine strength is not something to be earned in the future. It is already planted in you. Our challenge is not the absence of faith, but the courage to use it. Faith is not about the size of what we possess, but about the willingness to place what little we have into God's hands. And when we do, that little becomes more than enough.

So, as the winds return, let us not only secure our homes but also anchor our hearts more deeply in God. Every storm, whether of nature or of life, is an invitation from the Lord to lean on Him and to exercise the faith already given to us.
