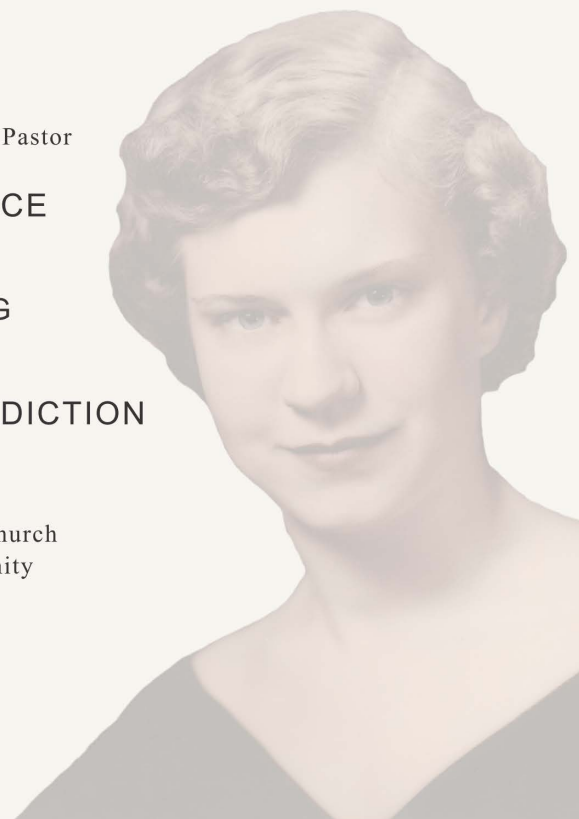

THE LIFE OF CAROLYN ENGLAND

Carolyn Louise (Springer) England was born in Palmerton, PA on November 1, 1934 to Virginia and Richard Springer. Carolyn was the eldest of two girls who resided most of their young lives in Indianapolis, IN. She earned an Associate Degree from William Woods College in Fulton, MO. Just 21 years old, Carolyn met engineer Gene England at church, and they married June 3, 1956 in Indianapolis. They lived in St. Louis, MO and Huntsville, AL before returning to Creve Coeur, MO outside of St. Louis to raise their three children. Beth was born in 1958, Bill in 1960 and Cathy in 1963.



Carolyn was the quintessential homemaker and well regarded for her organizational talents and tidy habits. She and Gene participated in The Alpha Players community theater troupe in St. Louis for 20 years, camping and water skiing at Lake of the Ozarks with AP friends. Carolyn loved travel, whether in a camper or on a river boat in the U.S., or touring Europe conducting genealogy research. She was an accomplished seamstress, a Girl Scout Leader, Cub Scout Den Mother, frequent activity chaperone and carpool driver for her children. She and Gene owned a hobby and toy store for a few years, and after selling it, Carolyn enjoyed a part-time position at the local Hallmark shop. They were members of Hope Presbyterian Church in Creve Coeur, where they made life-long friends and organized snow skiing trips to the West.

Carolyn and Gene left St. Louis for Caldwell, ID in 1994. Dubbed G-ma by her grandchildren, Carolyn frequently cared for them and her great grandchildren, enjoying a close relationship with all. She loved hosting family gatherings with rousing games of Uno.

Though diminutive in size, she was energetic with an endless work ethic, always ready for adventure, and could talk to anyone, making them feel at ease.

She was a Caldwell PEO chapter member and an avid Caldwell Fine Arts supporter. Our mother, sister, G-ma, and friend

passed away peacefully in sleep at St. Alphonsus Hospital in Boise on March 16, 2018 after a brief illness. She was years young. During her last weeks, she gave the gift of saying goodbye to all of her family and close friends.

Carolyn is survived by three children and their spouses - Beth Kopadt (Kurt) of Greenleaf ID, Bill England (Heather) of Shawnee KS, Cathy Springman (Kurt) of Bellevue WA; six grandchildren and spouses – Amanda Dixon (Byron), Traci Buchanan (Brendan), Cactus and Sami

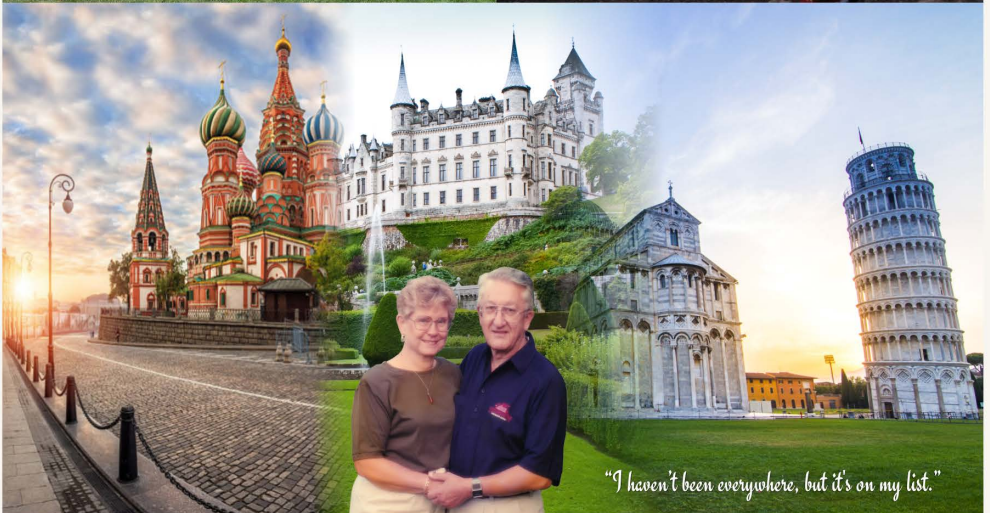
