Every five years and by state law, the California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE) as a unit of the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) reapproves the operation of post-secondary institutions. PMCI as a post-secondary institution, is again in the process of obtaining another reapproval to operate for another five years. Professional Medical Careers Institute (PMCI) recently received notice from the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE) indicating that PMCI's renewal of approval to operate as a non-accredited institution was denied approval pending our completion and submission of more recent financial documents. PMCI is appealing the notice of denial and cooperating with the BPPE to remedy any deficiencies forthwith and maintain our current approval with the BPPE to operate as an Institution in California. PMCI can continue to operate during this appeal process for renewal in accordance with California Education Code § 94891(c)(2). Peradventure, the institution loses the appeal, the institution may be subject to a variety of risks and uncertainties that could result in potential institutional closure. We are committed to maintaining compliance with all Federal and State laws pertaining to the operations of our school and approval from all relevant regulatory departments, boards, and bureaus.

An institution that has filed an appeal of a denial of a renewal application may continue to operate during the appeal process but must disclose in a written statement, approved by the bureau, to all current and prospective students, that the institution's application for renewal of approval to operate was denied by the bureau because the bureau determined the application did not satisfy the requirements to operate in California, that the institution is appealing the bureau's decision, and that the loss of the appeal may result in the institution's closure.

California Education Code § 94891(c)(2) allows us to continue to operate while this Appeal is pending. We have the success of our students and complete compliance with all licensing agencies as our number one priority. We are working to resolutely resolve this matter.
