Hike Reports ...

Alum Creek Mountain Bike P2

April 13, 2013 John Troutman, leader Jamie Abel, sweep

18 members hiked on the six-mile Central Ohio Mountain Bike Organization (COMBO) trail Phase 2 (P2). This is the second of two mountain bike trails created within the park. It was well maintained and had nice views of the water. There were only a few bicyclers on the trail on this cold, windy, damp day. The group dined at Smokey Bones Restaurant, near the Polaris Fashion Place Mall.

Clear Creak Metro Park

The 5-mile hike started with a 700-foot climb through woodlands and then followed the ridgeline along a wide grassy road. The last section featured a couple of long steep climbs that passed through hemlock ravines and rose to the ridge top over rocky terrain with sandstone outcroppings. The group of 21 hikers dined at Todd's Mountain View Restaurant, Lancaster.

Prairie Oaks Metro Park

This five-mile hike featured 24 members crossing a newer section of the park on the east side of the Big Darby Creek. They walked across a bridge, past a big fishing pond and then back along the creek. The group dined at Der Dutchman Restaurant, Plain City.

Great Seal State Park

Sept. 30, 2012 Dick Barbee, leader Jeanne Barbee, sweep



Emma Rowena Gatewood, better known as Grandma Gatewood (Oct. 25, 1887–June 4, 1973), was an extreme hiker and ultra-light hiking pioneer who was the first woman to hike the 2,168-mile (3,489 km) Appalachian Trail from Mount Oglethorpe in Georgia to Mount Katahdin in Maine solo, and in one season.

Gatewood was born in Guyan Township, Gallia County, Ohio. She was a farmer's wife who had eleven children and 24 grandchildren, thirty great-grandchildren, and one

great-great-grandchild living at the time of her death at 85.

Gatewood hiked the Appalachian Trail in 1955 at the age of 67, wearing Keds sneakers and carrying an army blanket, a raincoat, and a plasticshower curtain, which she carried in a homemade bag slung over one shoulder, thus making her a pioneer of ultra-light backpacking. Local newspapers picked up on her story, leading to a



profile in Sports Illustrated when she had reached Connecticut and an appearance on the Today Show.

Gatewood had read about it in a National Geographic Magazine. "I thought it would be a nice lark," she said, adding "It wasn't." Another time she complained "For some fool reason, they always lead you right up over the biggest rock to the top of the biggest mountain they can find."

She hiked it again in 1960 and then again at age 75 in 1963, making her the first person to hike the trail three times (though her final hike was completed in sections). She was also credited with being the oldest female thruhiker by the Appalachian Trail Conference until 2007.

In addition, she walked 2,000 miles (3,200 km) of the Oregon Trail from Independence, Missouri, to Portland, Oregon, averaging 22 miles (35 km) a day. She traveled to every state of the continental United States.

Gatewood was a life member of the National Campers and Hikers Association and the Roanoke Appalachian Trail Club. She was Director Emeritus and a lifetime member of the Buckeye Trail Association.
