<i>Wisteria frutescens</i>	Wisteria		Blooms as well as the popular exotics

<i>Parthenocissus quinquefolia</i>	Virginia Creeper		padded tendrils; bright red fall color

<i>Akebia quinata</i>	Chocolate vine	Highly invasive!
<i>Lonicera japonica</i>	Japanese honeysuckle	Highly invasive!
<i>Wisteria floribunda</i>	Japanese wisteria	Invasive
<i>Wisteria sinensis</i>	Chinese wisteria	Invasive
