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Medication Nursing Assistant (MNA)	Communicates questions, concerns, and/or	A Medication Nursing Assistant (MNA) is a Licensed Nursing Assistant (LNA) who has completed a Board approved medication administration program conducted by a Board approved Registered Nurse. Board approved medication administration programs must offer a minimum of 30 hours of theoretical content and 30 hours of clinical content. In order to qualify as a student to take a Board approved medication administration program, there are strict criteria. The LNA must have the following qualifications: - he/she must hold a valid and unrestricted nursing assistant license, - he/she have been employed as a LNA within the past 5 years for an equivalent of 2 years of full time employment, and - he/she must possess proficiency in English and basic math.			> Is this something partners hire for? > Is this a real position in BH environments?
	Able to properly chart medications administered/ assisted and immediately report to the nurse those medications not administered/ assisted for any reason. Answers emergency calls and attends to residents' needs promptly. Responsible for maintaining adequate supply and documentation of meds (ordering and reordering)	Upon completion of a Board approved medication administration program, the LNA must apply to the Board of Nursing and be issued a "Certificate" to administer medications. Certification as a MNA allows the LNA to administer medications under the supervision of a RN/LPN to "stable" clients.
