Life-Study of John - Study Guide

Dear brothers and sisters,

We will continue this week's truth pursuit with Message 49 of the *Life-study of John*, entitled "Life in Resurrection (4)". In this message we come to John 21:15-25, where we see that the Lord not only moved and lived with the believers (John 21:1-14), but He is also working and walking with the believers.

Here is an excerpt from this message followed by key verses for pray-reading and questions for your study:

"...in John 20 and 21 ... It begins with the discovery of the Lord's resurrection and ends with His coming back. These two chapters show everything that will happen to us between the Lord's resurrection and His coming back. Between these two events are all the things related to the Christian life during the church age: seeking the Lord with love toward Him especially in the personal morning watch; seeing the Lord in resurrection; receiving the revelation of the issue of the Lord's resurrection concerning the "brothers" and the "Father" by experiencing His manifestation; meeting with the believers to enjoy the Lord's presence; being breathed on by the Lord with the Holy Spirit and being sent by the Lord with His commission and authority to represent Him; learning how to live by faith in the Lord and to trust in Him for our daily living; loving the Lord with our natural strength having been dealt with and having learned the lesson of being broken, of losing our self-confidence, and of putting our trust in the Lord; shepherding the flock for the building of the church; practicing the Lord's invisible presence in which some follow Him even to death to glorify God, not by self-will but according to His leading, and some live until He comes back.

... The very eternal Word has become such a breath, such a Spirit. This is the processed God for our enjoyment. He is now the life and the Spirit in resurrection, moving, living, working, and walking with us. ... As the life, the Spirit, the holy breath, in resurrection He is constantly with us invisibly. He will continue with us invisibly, meeting, moving, living, working, and walking with us, until He comes visibly. This is the very Jesus Christ in whom we believe; the very Lord whom we have received; the very God whom we serve, worship, and enjoy; and the very all-inclusive Spirit who is always with us and within us. ... The Gospel of John has no conclusion... [It] is not closed; it is still under the Spirit's composition. ... and we are included in its composition. Praise the Lord!" (Witness Lee, *Life-study of John*, Living Stream Ministry, Anaheim, CA, msg. 49).

Key Verses for pray-reading: John 21:15-25.

Questions/Study Points:

1. In the Christian life, we are often like Peter—full of confidence in ourselves and relying on our own strength. How did the Lord help Peter be stripped of his love for the Lord and no longer depend on his natural strength and self-confidence, but instead be empowered by the Holy Spirit to live and walk the Christian life?
2. After restoring Peter's love for Him, the Lord Jesus charged him with feeding His lambs and shepherding His sheep. What is the spiritual significance of this charge, and how does it apply to our Christian life today?
3. In John 21:18–23, the Lord charged His disciples to follow Him. He also spoke of the time "until I come," indicating that He would no longer be physically with them. How could the disciples continue to follow Him if He were no longer with them in the flesh?
