ELEMENTARY GRADES 1 – 6

Wise Business Stewart - Kingdom Kids Ministry - \$100/Semester - (ages 5 - 10) 40% Sibling discount available

Wise Business Steward is a program created to discover the stewardship potential of your child through a hands-on entrepreneurial project that focuses on the exploration of creative ideas and the learning of how to manage time, money, and talents. During this semester children will create a business idea of their own, they will be guided step by step each week to develop and discover their interests and transform them into a business experience. Children

will learn to create a logo, a business card, a schedule, and much more! Each class is different and considers the different learning styles of children of this age (5 to 10). Guides and examples will be provided for parents to work at home with their kids. Materials to develop this project are basic and can be found around the house (a list will be provided as well). Science Talk: Experimentation & Conversation - Laini Ibrahim - Grades 4th -7th (or ages 9-13), \$105/semester

We will explore the properties and laws of science. We will start by making experiments and saving our observations in notebooks. Then we will learn how to talk about science and use those conversations to create our own scientific investigations. Topics will include chemistry, electronics, ecology, laws of physics, and biology. Students must have the desire to explore, the strength to use a manual hole puncher, the skills to write a sentence, the wisdom and composure to not hinder the learning of others, and the organization to know where their materials are before class. Parents must be present if any of the above are skills in process, but not yet attained.

Sibling Discount - 20% with family shared materials

Teacher discount - 30%, must be a Co-Op instructor teaching 2 or more courses.

JA Biztown - Dawn Williams - (4th - 6th graders) \$80/student

Student participates in a series of classroom lessons, where they learn about applying for jobs, voting, career opportunities, customer service, paychecks, savings and more. Then, they put their knowledge to work at JA Biz-Town, where they operate a simulated economy and run businesses. They get hands-on experience at being citizens, consumers, employees and business owners. Duration: 2 semesters

Intro to Theater: Performance Drama - Kai Jackson - \$65/semester (Grades 3rd-7th)

This Fall semester, students will be introduced to the world of theater through mime and pantomime! They will explore and study theatrical elements of plot and character development to learn how this comedic form of expression works to convey a whole story! By the end of the semester students will write and perform their own 5 unit pantomime show (It's easier than it seems!) and have a new awareness of body language and non verbal expressions/ communication. To get the most out of the class, some assignments will involve watching video content, recording and submitting video content, and require the assistance of an adult. Duration: 2 Semesters

MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES

General Chemistry - Laini Ibrahim - Grades 9th -12th , New Students \$150/semester, Continuing Students \$120 OR \$105/semester (Labs only)

Objective: to provide students with a high school depth study of the principles of Chemistry and the nature of elements, compounds and their structure and reactions. Laboratory Materials and text included as applicable.

Two Class Fee Options:

- 1) \$150 per semester - All inclusive, including text, semester grade, and lab kit. Parents provide some household materials.
- 2) \$105 per semester - Lab only (No text, and no grading)

Sibling discount - 20% with shared materials

Teacher discount - 30%, full course option only, must be a Co-Op instructor teaching 2 or more courses.

Class size limited. Full Course registrants get preferred admission.

Intro. to Music Theory & History (from a Christian Perspective) - Lolli McLeroy - Ages 12+, \$50/semester

This class will give an overview of music history and theory from the Ancient times through to the Classical period. Classical, folk and popular styles will be covered. Special emphasis will be given to keyboard music, the place of music in culture, spiritual lives of the great composers and the role of music in worship. Weekly listening, reports projects, reading and research will be assigned. A previous background in music is not required. Duration: 2 semesters

***Best for Students 12 and up (but available for enthusiastic and mature students who are slightly younger upon request)

Intro to Public Speech & Debate - Lolli McLeroy, (7th - 12 grade) , \$50/semester

This class will use the NCFCA curriculum* (from IEW**) to prepare students for public speaking and debate. Students will be expected to research, write and speak in front of the class on a weekly basis. IEW Speech Boot Camp materials will be included as part of the course. Duration: 2 semesters

Pre-Algebra - Josette Boatright – \$100/semester

This Pre-Algebra course is an introduction to basic algebra concepts and a review of arithmetic algorithms. The course emphasizes the concepts necessary to be successful in Algebra I and II. The course helps students develop good mathematical study skills and learning strategies. Students will explore algebraic expressions and integers, solve one-step equations and inequalities, decimals and equations, factors, fractions, exponents, operations with fractions, ratios, proportions, percents, linear functions and graphing, area and volume. Duration: 2 semesters

Algebra 1 – Josette Boatright – \$100/semester

This class will help students learn how to solve algebraic equations, learn basic algebra terms and tools, as well as assist students with their mathematical struggles and insecurities. Students are encouraged to bring in math questions from their own curriculum. Tutoring will also be available. Algebra 1 is designed to give students a foundation for all future mathematics courses. The fundamentals of algebraic problem-solving are explained. Students will explore: foundations of Algebra, solving equations, solving inequalities, an introduction to functions, linear functions, systems of equations and inequalities, exponents and exponential functions, polynomials and factoring, quadratic functions and equations, radical expressions and equations, and data analysis and probability. Duration: 2 semesters.

STUDENT & PARENT CLUBS

Yearbook Club - *Donielle Kazim & Wulna Guillaume*

Fee: None

Students will be tasked with creation and layout of the 2020-2021 HHH Yearbook.

A timeline for each task and "job descriptions" for the different things the kids do will be discussed at the first meeting. This is an excellent club for building leadership skills.

Some parental assistance will be necessary (i.e. transportation to cover certain events, initial help navigating yearbook software, etc..).

Book Club - *Lolli McLeroy , ages 12+*

Fee: None (Books must be purchased individually)

Book club is a great opportunity to read (or revisit) classic literature and discuss it with other students. Themes and literary analysis will be discussed. Students will also be encouraged to share opinions about characters and plot. Each new book will be voted in as a group from a parent approved list.
