We are just getting started with the actual design process. Gathering the survey information is our first step. We are looking to utilize a lot of the existing footprint of the intersection to create the roundabout. From a conceptual standpoint it would look something like the following below.



If we are able to utilize a lot of the existing footprint we are able to minimize impacts on right-of-way needs. From a conceptual standpoint it doesn't look like we'll be affecting the sign. However, everything will be confirmed as we move a little further into design.

The design itself would probably take about a year, which would put us into construction Spring of 2021. I think that once we receive the survey information back from our crews and are able to take a hard look at what the impacts are, it would be good at that point in time to meet with the community.
