# Little Tiger Award Presented to the Business Advisory Council

In addition to the community grants that are presented at the annual Awards Breakfast, the 2025 Joy Roth Little Tiger Award was also announced. This year's recipient of the Little Tiger Award was the Ottawa County Business Advisory Council (BAC).

The award, established to honor the legacy of OCCF founder Joy Roth, recognizes champions who go above and beyond to give back to the community. Accepting the 2025 award were Katherine Adams, Director of Workforce Innovation at the Ottawa County Improvement

Corporation, and Clay Finken, Chair of the BAC.

Katherine described the successes the BAC has made through the Skilled Trades Academy (2019 inception) and with the addition of the State Tested Nurse Aide (STNA) program in 2024.

## Drone Assists Local Fire Departments

The OCCF, in partnership with the Sandusky County Communities Foundation, provided a grant to the Lindsey Volunteer Fire Department (LVFD) for a drone equipped with a camera featuring incredible zoom, light, and focus capabilities, as well as a high-intensity light source and thermal sensors to detect objects with varying heat temperatures.

"Seven of the LVFD members are trained and licensed to operate the drone," said Jason Conklin, LVFD Deputy Chief.

"The drone will be used to find lost persons or search in areas not easily accessible, like riverbanks or fields with tall vegetation. It can also be used to safely monitor a fire and guide firefighters, increasing their safety margin."

LVFD has a close working relationship with volunteer fire departments in Elmore, Oak Harbor, and Bay Township in Ottawa County. These departments each have their own special equipment that they use to support each other.

## Koenig Family - a Legacy of Service

Brian Koenig was raised in Fremont, Ohio, in a family that made giving back to the community a priority. His introduction to the Ottawa County Community Foundation came when his neighbor, former OCCF Trustee Blair Miller, shared information about the various opportunities available through a community foundation to meet a donor's philanthropic goals.

"Blair asked if I had considered starting a scholarship fund in memory of my wife, Pam, who had recently passed away," Brian explained. Wanting to learn more, Koenig explored the various fund options available with the OCCF and decided to proceed with a memorial scholarship.

"One thing that was important to me was the ability to set the selection criteria," Brian reflects. "Pam was an elementary school teacher, a track and cross-country coach, and served as president of the Woodmore Youth Soccer Program. We decided to align the scholarship criteria with her interests."

Each year, since it was established 14 years ago, the Pamela Graver-Koenig Memorial Scholarship has been awarded to a high-achieving Woodmore High School senior who participated in soccer, track, or cross country during high school and is pursuing a career related to children.

Koenig is proud of the scholarships his fund has provided and pleased that his giving will continue in perpetuity. He is also gratified to see the impact OCCF grants have had in the Elmore area, benefiting Christy's Corner Café, Harris-Elmore Library, Schedel Arboretum & Gardens, Elmore Historical Society, and Ottawa National Wildlife Refuge.

Brian went on to serve as a trustee on the OCCF board. During that time, he learned firsthand about the power of a community foundation and the need it has for operating funds to support the cost of administering grants, scholarships, special projects, as well as normal operational expenses.
