### I. Introduction

The Union of Saints affirms the inherent autonomy and dignity of every human being.

In recent years, many members of our communities have experienced increased exposure to hostile, racialized, and dehumanizing rhetoric, particularly online. Social media platforms amplify outrage, accelerate division, and magnify fringe hostility into what can feel like widespread societal destabilization.

### II. The Constitutional Framework

The United States protects speech under the:

- First Amendment to the United States Constitution

The Supreme Court has consistently held that even offensive or racist speech is protected unless it crosses narrow lines.

Two key cases define this protection:

#### **Brandenburg v. Ohio**

Speech may only be punished if it:

1. Is intended to incite lawless action

2. Is likely to produce imminent lawless action

Abstract hostility is protected. Immediate incitement is not.

Does *US* agree? *Not necessarily*. *US* is concerned with spiritual healing and recognizes spiritual harms as they are. Prior to these cases, *hateful and racist speech* was not as protected as it is today. ***Our position is that we do feel that hateful and racist speech should be challenged.***

## **Matal v. Tam**

The Court affirmed that there is no general “hate speech” exception in U.S. law. The government may not suppress speech simply because it is offensive or disparaging.

### **Key Principle:**

The Constitution protects liberty from government censorship, even when speech is morally troubling.

## **III. When Speech Becomes Unlawful**

While offensive speech is protected, conduct is not.

Speech may become legally actionable when it involves:

- True threats
- Targeted harassment
- Stalking
- Doxxing
- Incitement to immediate violence
- Discriminatory conduct

The distinction between ideas and intimidation is crucial.

The Union of Saints supports strong enforcement against conduct that harms or coerces others.

## **IV. The Social Media Amplification Effect**

Modern digital platforms:

- Reward outrage
- Promote emotionally charged content

- Create echo chambers

- Block and report.
- Document repeated targeting.
- Limit algorithm exposure.
- Seek support within trusted community.

### **If You Experience In-Person Intimidation:**

- Prioritize safety.
- Document details.
- Report threats or reckless conduct.
- Do not escalate confrontation.

### **If You Experience Targeted Harassment:**

- Consult legal counsel.
  - Preserve evidence.
  - Consider formal complaints or protective measures.

## **VII. Protecting Emotional Stability**

Repeated exposure to hostility can create:

- Hypervigilance
- Exhaustion
- Anxiety
- Social withdrawal

These are nervous system responses and can harm our social and physical health.

The Union of Saints encourages:

- Community grounding

- Professional therapeutic support when needed

## If Your Goal Is: Personal Protection

### 1 Platform (Online Harassment)

Write to:

- The platform's trust & safety team
- Formal reporting channels
- Legal compliance department (if threats or doxxing)

If harassment is severe, your next letter is to:

- The individual (cease-and-desist)
- Or local law enforcement (if threats)

## If Your Goal Is: Change State Law

Write to:

- Your **state representative**
- Your **state senator**

Most harassment and criminal statutes are state-level.

Request:

- A meeting
- Or to submit a written policy memo

Bring:

- Specific statutory language
- Documented examples
- Narrow reform proposal

This is often the most realistic route.

## If Your Goal Is: Federal Law Reform

Write to:

- Your U.S. House Representative
- Your U.S. Senator

But understand:

Federal speech restrictions face extremely high constitutional barriers under the **First Amendment to the United States Constitution**.

Federal reform works better when framed around:

- Interstate stalking
- Cyber-harassment
- Doxxing
- Platform transparency

---

## **If Your Goal Is: Constitutional Change**

Then you are in one of two lanes:

### **A. Judicial Philosophy Lane**

You influence:

- Presidential elections
- Senate confirmations
- Judicial advocacy organizations

### **B. Constitutional Amendment**

You would be advocating to:

- Members of Congress
- State legislatures for ratification

This is generational, not immediate.

---

## **If Your Goal Is: Platform Accountability**

Write to:

- Company policy teams
- Public policy directors
- Shareholders (if publicly traded)
- Advertisers
- Industry oversight committees

Private companies are not bound by the First Amendment the same way government is.

---

## **If Your Goal Is: Community-Level Stabilization**

Write to:

- Local civic leaders
- Faith organizations
- Bar associations
- Professional organizations

Cultural norms often shift faster than doctrine.

---

## **As a Lawyer, Your Most Effective First Letter**

Realistically?

If you want something that could actually move:

Write to your **state legislator** with a narrowly tailored anti-harassment proposal.

Not “ban hate speech.”

But:

“Strengthen protections against repeated targeted digital intimidation.”
