## White Women Drooling? Facebook

In Facebook and Instagram's recent front-facing advertisements, White women appear noticeably smaller and less prominent than other figures. White men are largely absent from the campaign imagery. The presentation of demographic groups within advertising continues to influence public discussion regarding representation and identity.

One advertisement depicts a White woman's face drooling. Rather than presenting the image directly, the artwork appears on a hand in an abstract form. Whether the image is intended as artistic expression, symbolism, or social commentary, it remains an unusual choice for a public-facing advertisement during a period of heightened discussion regarding race, identity, and representation.

## **The Instigators**

Meta Platforms acquired Instagram years ago. More recently, Instagram underwent significant changes and now closely resembles Facebook in both appearance and functionality. The similarities between the two platforms are far more noticeable than in previous years.

The platform increasingly emphasizes algorithms, advertising, and engagement-driven content. Since the pandemic era, social media platforms have played an expanding role in shaping public discourse, cultural trends, and political conversations. Influence, incentives, and platform priorities remain important subjects of discussion.

## **One Big Ring**

A wide range of activist groups, political organizations, criminal enterprises, media networks, and advocacy movements now compete for influence across digital platforms. Digital communication has increased the visibility of these competing interests and expanded their ability to reach large audiences. Public debate frequently centers on how these groups influence culture, policy, and public opinion.

Many Americans express concern that efforts to address social, economic, and security challenges are frequently met with resistance, criticism, or competing interests. At the same time, social media platforms continue to influence which viewpoints receive visibility and which receive less attention. Discussions involving moderation policies, algorithms, and platform governance continue across political and ideological lines.

Participation in online movements can create self-reinforcing cycles in which particular narratives, beliefs, and behaviors become increasingly normalized over time. Political activism, media influence, public safety, and social cohesion remain recurring themes throughout this research project. These issues continue to shape public discourse across multiple sectors of society.

### **Stop American Act?**

I do not view the "Stop Nick Shirley Act" as an act in the traditional legislative sense. I view it as part of an ongoing conflict involving journalism, public discourse, political activism, and information campaigns. The subject reflects continuing tensions involving media, political influence, and public communication.

A recurring pattern appears throughout modern political debates. Individuals or groups identify a problem, attempt to address it, and then encounter opposition from competing political, social, or institutional interests. Similar dynamics can be found across a variety of policy and advocacy issues.

Similar patterns appear in anti-statist campaigns and other forms of political activism. College-aged populations are frequently exposed to political messaging and often become active participants in movements that carry consequences extending beyond campus environments. Educational institutions continue to play an important role in the development of political engagement and civic participation.

Foreign influence operations continue to play an important role in information campaigns and political messaging. Similar patterns appear across multiple organizations, campaigns, and platforms. The repetition of these themes across different environments remains a recurring subject within this Casebook.

The political climate in the United States remains highly polarized. Public trust, political escalation, institutional stability, and civic participation continue to influence national discussions. These issues remain important areas for continued research and analysis.

The Trump administration, as of early 2026, expanded military operations in Latin America with a focus on combating drug cartels designated as foreign terrorist organizations. The administration promoted a Shield of the Americas coalition and encouraged military cooperation against cartel networks operating throughout the region. These developments marked a significant shift in regional security policy.

Key areas of focus included anti-cartel operations, military cooperation with Ecuador, continued discussions with Mexico regarding cartel enforcement, and expanded security activities throughout the Caribbean region. The strategy also emphasized strengthening U.S. influence throughout the Western Hemisphere while addressing growing Chinese influence in the region. Regional security and international cooperation remain central themes within these developments.

## **POLICY BRIEF**

# **ADDRESSING THE THREAT OF CARTELS AND ORGANIZED CRIME IN THE UNITED STATES**

### **Problem Statement**

The influence of transnational cartels and organized crime networks poses a growing threat to U.S. citizens. These groups operate both domestically and abroad, exploiting vulnerabilities in

border security and immigration systems. Their presence undermines public safety, destabilizes communities, and exposes vulnerable populations to cycles of violence and exploitation.

## **Threat Assessment**

Cartel activity in the United States continues to receive significant attention from law enforcement and policymakers. These organizations maintain extensive criminal networks and operate across multiple jurisdictions. Their activities affect public safety, economic stability, and community well-being.

Women and children often face heightened risks when exposed to criminal organizations and trafficking networks. Coercion, exploitation, and abuse remain significant concerns in these environments. Protecting vulnerable populations remains an important public policy objective.

## **Importance of Immigration and Citizenship Law**

Most immigrants contribute positively to society through work, family, and community involvement. At the same time, immigration and citizenship laws remain important components of national security and public administration. Effective enforcement helps reduce opportunities for criminal organizations to exploit legal and administrative systems.

Long-term solutions depend on balancing security objectives with humanitarian responsibilities.

# **KEY ASPECTS OF U.S. MILITARY STRATEGY IN LATIN AMERICA (2026)**

- Targeting Cartels: The U.S. has labeled drug cartels as foreign terrorist organizations, treating them as a “war on terror” target rather than a law enforcement issue.

- “Shield of Americas” Coalition: The U.S. has formed a 16-country coalition aimed at using “lethal military force” to eradicate drug networks, promising U.S. firepower.
- Military Action in Ecuador: The U.S. Southern Command confirmed joint military operations with Ecuador began in March 2026, targeting narco trafficker networks.
- Pressure on Mexico: The U.S. has repeatedly pressured Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum to allow U.S. Special Operations Forces to join raids against fentanyl labs, though she has resisted, according to.
- Regional Intervention: The U.S. is increasing its military presence in the Caribbean, conducting strikes on alleged drug boats, and has been linked to the capture of Venezuela’s Nicolas Maduro.
- Strategic Shift: The policy aims to solidify U.S. dominance in the Western Hemisphere and counter Chinese influence.

These actions, described as “an act of war” by some observers due to the use of lethal force, represent a significant shift towards aggressive intervention in the region.
