

Women's Sexual Health, OSIRAM vs. OZIRAH, Modern Trafficking & Genocide

We can discuss women's sexual health openly and honestly. While other churches may promote abstinence, or claim that sex in all forms is unhealthy unless one is married, we are not that church. We are science and truth based. We are women founded. We are adjusting our sails to represent our Mother Goddess more fully, as she was deeply harmed by misogyny. She was even called a whore. Many encounter these profane words in Mormon texts and find them alarming, and rightly so.

There is a clear difference between OSIRAM and OZIRAH.

OSIRAM is boundary pushing, often assaulting. It is upside down love, rooted in hatred, self hatred, and outward hatred. It is fragmented. It represents something untrue.

OZIRAH has flow. OZIRAH feels right. OZIRAH protects our health. OZIRAH synergizes with every cell in our body to elevate us and uplift our spirit. OZIRAH is true and unconditional love, often more love than human beings can even interpret.

Now we must address modern activism, particularly male activists on the red pill, pickup artist side. Even discussing this topic feels weighted and agitating to our gut and spirit. These are not men, they are holocausters. They are warfarists and enslavists. They are untrue, and they are a pathology to the human spirit. They teach everything opposite of what we truly are.

To stay true to ourselves and others is to embrace innocence and to move with the flow of life and God. It is not forced. It does not manipulate. It does not command behavior according to a trafficker's plan. It is never a numbers game or a judgment game. This is satanism in a nutshell. At the Union of Saints, we call this OSIRAM.

When holocausters or traffickers maim women in this way, they harm women to the level of genocide. Women will remove themselves entirely from their true selves, their loving nature, friendliness, warmth, dating, joy, and enjoyment of life. These traffickers shorten a woman's lifespan and can prevent her from having offspring or children. When politics become involved, this becomes racial genocide, which we are witnessing now, particularly against white women, who have been relentlessly targeted by activists.

I myself was a victim. I stand before you as a witness.

Men of this era, primarily ages 25 to 35, many foreign, we believed they were American and learned the hard way that they were not. First born immigrant males are a real challenge for white American women. They do not want us to succeed. They view us as a conflict and as something to dominate. They demand submission. We have all heard this language floating around. They claim they want to lead, but they lead women to hell. They thwart education and careers while calling women horrific names in the process.

This is not natural. This is not OZIRAH. This is impure OSIRAM.

OSIRAM is what is impure, not OZIRAH.

OZIRAH tells us to be free, to love, to enjoy life, and to find peace within ourselves. These lessons are simple. They move with us, not against us. We feel this truth in our heart, our soul, and our body.

Furthermore, while other churches may punish women for taking care of their sexual health, we are not that church. We understand the human body systems. We know women. We speak from a woman's point of view. Women must care for their sexual health, or they may experience pain, endometriosis, uterine pain, back pain, hip pain, and deep bodily imbalance. A woman may feel off kilter if she does not nurture her body.

These are natural processes. This is how OZIRAH made us.

We are not simply human beings, we are flow beings. We are beings of tides, ebb and flow, and sun. We move with time and cycles. We nurture what our bodies ask of us.

This church is not for red pill artists, traffickers, body count activists, genociders, holocausters, racists, or those who seek to purify women. We are forgiving. We are mighty. We are loving. But these souls are forsaken here.

Our obligation is to protect our peace, our safety, and our dignity so that we may remain aligned with our Goddess and our God, in mind, body, and soul.

Perhaps they have learned from us. We hope they have. But we know, and they know, they took a very wrong turn. It became so out of control that an entire country of women suffered, some to their deaths. White women now account for three out of four suicides in this country. This abuse is not to be taken lightly.

This was the worst OSIRAM chapter humanity has seen.

It arose from imbalance, men seeking control and power over women, dominating them, stripping women of life and liberty, and dragging them toward hell.

Do we forgive such an OSIRAM?
