

Democratic Policy, Extraordinary Threats and Acts of War Against American People

It has become increasingly clear that the policies and actions of the **Democratic Party** raise serious concerns regarding crimes against humanity, the instrumentalization of mass migration, and conduct that constitutes **acts of war** against the American people. These policies are posing a grave threat to the safety, security, stability, and well being of the American population. This is no longer merely a matter of politics or political disagreement. Their actions are constituting acts of war, terrorism, violence, and treason against the American people and must be investigated and examined, with strong lawful **intervention** taken accordingly.

Just a few of these policies and proposals are outlined by NumbersUSA below.

It's hard to get much more radical on immigration than a 0% NumbersUSA Grade, but some politicians are trying.

Rep. Haley Stevens ([0% Grade](#)) lost Michigan's Democratic Senate primary this week to Abdul El-Sayed, who is running on [abolishing ICE](#).

The *Boston Globe* asked three writers: [Is 'Abolish ICE' is a winning slogan](#) for Democrats?

One warned that it may remind voters of Biden's border crisis and why Democrats lost trust on the issue in the first place. Another argued that abolishing ICE wasn't the same as calling for open borders, although he didn't explain how.

And a third -- Joan Vennochi -- asked the practical question: What bills would be likely to move under a Democratic majority?

There are already four bills to either fully defund or abolish ICE outright. A fifth bill (H.R. 6390) rescinds the entire \$175 billion Congress allocated last year for border and interior enforcement. A total of [109](#) unique representatives are signed on to these bills. By comparison, the House-passed SAVE Act has 110 cosponsors.

Could an "Abolish ICE" bill move next year? Yes, it absolutely could.

Here are some other ideas that have found traction in [legislation](#) introduced by Democrats this Congress:

- Make every illegal alien who avoids deportation for 7 years eligible for a green card.

(H.R. 4696 / S. 2468)

- Give green cards to every temporary or illegal worker who has been in the U.S. since the middle of the border surge and works an "essential" job like manufacturing or dry cleaning. (H.R. 5098)
- Prohibit enforcement within dense urban areas. (H.R. 1061 / S. 455)
- Mandate catch-and-release. (H.R. 6397 / S. 3702)
- Allow illegal aliens to claim a renter's tax credit. (H.R. 6390)
- Nearly triple the H-1B program. (H.R. 6305)
- Expand chain migration and the visa lottery; and allow an estimated 100,000 previously deported aliens to return. (H.R. 6565)

These insane ideas would supercharge a mass immigration surge even worse than the 2021-2025 border crisis. They show no regard for the millions of Americans who want a full-time job but can't find one -- or for the tens of millions who are stranded outside the labor force. These bills would bury them.

We're not going to let any of it happen. And we can start fighting now.

Take Action

The list above doesn't include the bipartisan Dignidad Act (H.R. 4393) to add over 17 million permanent foreign workers over ten years through amnesty and immigration increases.

And even now, a handful of Republicans are working with Democrats to force a floor vote on the largest legislative amnesty since 1986 (H.R. 1589), and similar in size. The bill offers nothing to American workers, nor any protections against the amnesty inciting another surge in illegal immigration. They are just [8 signatures short](#).
