So many have turned their backs against their fellow Americans. It is hurting Americans, and there comes a time when we need to say, they simply need to stop, and we Americans need to say, **no. No more special privileges.** “

“Americans have been enduring abuse from outsiders for too long, much due to a misunderstood history. People are fighting Americans over historical narratives they do not fully understand. Many are only first-generation Americans, and their entitlement is so severe that they feel it is okay and justified to target real Native Americans, particularly White Native Americans. So much so that it has become a war ~ asymmetrical, guerrilla, and often on foot ~ such as on hikes, on the trails, or on the streets. For a while, they were getting away with this all because we were not fully aware, the United States is young still, thankfully many Americans are waking up to this experience now. -Fourth Generational War, and it should be labeled a war, because it is.

The Topic:

"A New York mother of two was sl*shed across the throat after asking for directions on a birthday hike in Arizona.

Alexis Rowan, 27, was eight miles into a trip to Havasupai Falls near the Grand Canyon on August 12 when she became separated from her friend.

She asked the first person she saw, 29-year-old Taylor Nardo Paya, a member of the Havasupai Tribe, for directions to the gift shop.

Paya attacked her from behind. He cut her neck, punched her, pulled her hair, threw her to the ground, and tried to drag her away. The entire as\$ault was captured on a nearby Ring camera.

Rowan later said, "I felt my neck and I thought, oh my God, I'm going to d*e. I can't d*e like this. I have my kids to go home to." She fought him off, ran screaming, and was pulled to safety by a woman who opened her door. She received 10 stitches in her neck and three in her hand.

Paya is a convicted felon who previously served five years for a 2015 robbery involving a female victim and was ordered into s*x offender treatment.

He was arrested the next day after police tracked the phone he stole from Rowan. The case is being handled federally because it occurred on tribal land.

A man with a documented history of violence against women was free to attack another one. Just a reminder, Arizona is run by a Democrat.
