

Collective Guilt or Shame Politics by Modern Foreign Colonials

This experience is called Collective Guilt or Shame Politics, historically used as War Propaganda: When people present White Americans with a selective account of their own history, important parts of this history may be erased. I can tell that this speaker is young and approaches American history from an extreme left wing point of view. She does not appear to understand its full scope or the experiences of multigenerational Americans whose families have lived here for centuries. We can tell when American history is erased or falsified. We are actually from here.

Foreign entitlement in a nutshell: White Americans are not collectively “colonizers.” Many have family histories in America extending back 400 to 500 years or more, with generations of cultural development, sacrifice, military service, community building, and connection to the land. Treating an entire racial population as foreign, illegitimate, or collectively guilty is inherently racist. This makes you, the author, a racist, and this view is nothing to be proud of. Sadly, the opposite is true. History shows that forced displacement, demographic targeting, and the destruction of a people’s identity accompanies genocide and crimes against humanity. This experience is modern colonization, which is also nothing to be proud of.

Political language should never be used to excuse racial hostility, cultural erasure, or the denial of anyone’s humanity, as you have done here toward the entire Ethnic-White American population. We do not accept being told that our ancestry, history, or cultural identity has no legitimate place in America. No movement has the right to erase White Americans, Native Americans, or any other population from the nation’s history. Every community’s history should be discussed honestly, completely, and without collective guilt, blame, shame or racial condemnation. This is what happened in Germany: “These atrocities are your fault.” Yet, who is lighting American heritage sites on fire today and building foreign sites in their place?

Forced cultural assimilation is a crime against humanity, and, horrifically, this is something you are preaching. This is not a topic about rights. This is a topic of cultural and historical erasure and collective blame directed at an entire population: a natural, ancestral, and ethnic American population.
