Mosquito Spraying, Foreign & Domestic Threats

1. Mosquito Spraying

Please put clean air, mosquito geoengineering, and forced indoor use of insect sprays on the ballot. People have a right to know what they are being sprayed with—toxic heavy metal chemicals that reduce lifespan in our bodies. People have a right to know the full truth.

MILITARY BRIEFING: PUBLIC HEALTH AND NATIONAL SECURITY CONCERNS REGARDING MASS MOSQUITO-SPRAYING OPERATIONS

Subject: Assessment of Chemical Spraying Programs and Resulting Health and Human Rights Concerns

1. Purpose

This briefing provides a situational assessment of ongoing mosquito-control spraying operations across multiple counties in Florida. It documents firsthand symptoms, observed community impacts, potential long-term health consequences, and broader national security implications for veterans, elders, children, and the general public.

2. Background

- Mosquito spraying programs in the United States began during World War II and have remained operational for over 80 years.
- Many current programs employ permethrin-based fogging, a neurotoxin designed to kill insects on contact.
- Florida maintains some of the most aggressive spraying schedules in the nation, including:
 - Daily outdoor fogging
 - Routine roadside and highway fogging
 - Monthly indoor spraying in certain residential complexes

This operational tempo results in continuous public exposure to airborne chemical agents.

3. Personal Observations and Direct Exposure

As a 100% disabled veteran with prior toxic exposure, I experience acute, repeatable symptoms immediately following spray events. These include:

- Stinging skin, especially facial and forehead burning
- Rapid onset skin dryness and irritation
- Nerve-related sensations, including heart tightening
- Metallic taste in the back of the mouth
- Gland pain
- Uterine and breast pain
- Vein tightening, especially at night
- Chest pressure, circulatory strain, and sleep disruption

These symptoms are consistent and directly correlated with spray events. Physical exercise temporarily reduces some symptoms but increases exposure when outdoor air is contaminated.

4. Environmental Indicators

- Permethrin spray is lethal to insects, horseflies, and amphibians.
 - Multiple dead frogs were observed after spray events.
 - This indicates ecological disruption and confirms that the chemical is bioactive in the environment.
 - If it kills wildlife on contact, the assumption that humans are unaffected is not supported by field observations.

5. Community Impact and Lack of Informed Consent

Residents are not adequately warned about:

- Potential heart complications
- Possible cancer risks
- Long-term neurological impacts
- Fertility concerns
- Skin disorders caused by repeated chemical absorption

Residents, including elders, children, pregnant women, and disabled veterans—are routinely exposed without informed consent, representing:

- A public health failure
 - A boundary and autonomy violation
 - A potential human rights issue, given that air is a basic human need

6. Data-Driven Concerns

- Certain Florida cities show elevated cancer rates consistent with long-term environmental exposure.
 - Veterans exhibit:
 - Higher heart disease prevalence
 - Higher incidence of cardiac events
 - Shorter average lifespan
 - Florida veterans experience these issues at higher rates, raising concerns about compounded exposure from military service and ongoing community spraying.

7. Operational Risk Analysis

Risk Probability: High

Risk Severity: High

Affected Population: Entire civilian population within spray zones; amplified risk for medically vulnerable individuals

This qualifies as a continuous chemical exposure operation with daily health impacts.

There is also evidence of public communication gaps, where officials claim “only a few” individuals become ill, despite difficulty tracing chronic conditions directly to exposure.

8. Interactions with Spraying Companies

- Local spraying contractors are generally cooperative and respectful.
 - Many are willing to adjust routes or avoid specific areas when requested.
 - The issue is not personnel—it is the statewide system, mandates, and scale of deployment.
 - Operators themselves are not the threat; the policy and frequency are.

9. Key Finding

Current mosquito-control programs may pose greater day-to-day health risks than the mosquito-borne illnesses they aim to prevent, which:

- Rarely cause severe symptoms
- Are often asymptomatic
- Are almost never fatal in the United States

In contrast, permethrin exposure produces daily, recurrent symptoms for many residents.

10. Recommendation to the President and Public

A formal review is required, including:

- Federal audit of Florida spraying programs
- Updated toxicity assessments
- Mandatory public notification protocols
- Review of exposure levels among vulnerable populations
- Investigation into veteran health impacts
- Transparent disclosure of permethrin's long-term risks

Public education campaigns should be launched to inform residents of potential risks of chronic chemical exposure.

11. Personal Position

As a disabled veteran and long-time visitor to this region, I am distressed by the scale and lack of transparency. The spraying is directly affecting my health and the health of many residents. Public protest and structured advocacy may be necessary to protect the right to clean air and bodily autonomy.

This is not an attack on individuals or companies, it is a call for higher oversight to protect citizens.
