

Witnesses to White Targeting

We are serving as witnesses to “white targeting,” a concept many of us are not used to and goes against all we have been taught. We are standing up for ourselves, native, white Americans who are targets of modern warfare and slavery. We are the beautiful caucasian people of our great nation.

Part of what we are witnessing today — including what some call “racial profiling in America” — is a complex process of our government backtracing the vulnerabilities created by prior policies. The Biden administration, while potentially well-meaning, was at times blind to corruption and left openings that foreign and extremist actors exploited. Activists, unlike intelligence officers or military personnel, are not trained in national security. They often bring personal and ideological agendas into the political space, and when individuals with no security expertise gain influence over policy, the results can expose our nation to grave harm.

While we may not agree with every decision made by this current administration, it is important to recognize and respect the ongoing work of the FBI, DEA, police, border patrol, and other agencies as they labor to re-secure our nation. These organizations are tasked with the difficult job of unraveling past mistakes, addressing infiltration, and protecting citizens — and that process, while it may appear discriminatory against foreigners to some, is rooted in an urgent need to safeguard our security fabric and rebuild public trust.

We are prioritizing national security now because the threats we face are not theoretical — they are real, organized, and capable of doing great harm. From my research, it is clear that extremism exists on both sides of the political spectrum: just as there are anti-Black supremacist groups like the KKK, there are also anti-White extremist groups and other bad actors who, when given access or a “green light” into national security spaces, can wreak havoc on our country. These groups thrive when activism turns partisan and is allowed to override the judgment of trained intelligence officers and national security professionals.

This is why we are calling for a pause — even a neutralizing — of activism. We place our national security decisions into the hands of those who we trust and are honorable citizens in service, who are accountable to securing our borders, and focusing on protecting our country from bad actors and those who commit treason.

Our goal is not to silence legitimate voices but to retrace our steps, safeguard our national interests, and ensure that decisions impacting the safety of the American people are guided by expertise, not ideology. Only then can we rebuild the trust, unity, and strength necessary to keep our nation safe.
