A Movement: The Stages Witness

Stage 1: Formation

- Activist Movement (Underground)
- Early coordination, networking, and ideology development

Stage 2: Expansion

- Activist Movement (Aboveground)
- Public advocacy, visibility, and narrative building

Stage 3: Institutional Entry

- Rise to Power
- Monetary Support
- Electoral Participation

Stage 4: Political Positioning

- Influence within political parties and public policy discussions

Stage 5: Governmental Positioning

- Integration into governmental roles and decision-making structures

Stage 6: Harm Development

- Activist harms begin to translate into systemic impacts
- Discrimination, segregation, intelligence gathering, and ideological extremism

Stage 7: Escalation

- Governmental harms expand
- Trafficking, organized exploitation, and coordinated abuses

Stage 8: Mass Harm

- Widespread societal damage
- Large-scale coordination, conspiracy, and destabilization

Stage 9: Atrocity Phase

- Mass harms escalate into atrocities

Stage 10: Public Awareness

- Broader recognition emerges, often delayed
- Limited ability to reverse entrenched systems
