

“I Endorse Only Americans”

If I say, “I endorse only Americans in politics,” or “I would only vote for Americans for office,” what does that mean?

1. Civic Nationalism

Political decisions should prioritize U.S. citizens — their rights, safety, and well-being — regardless of race, religion, or background.

This aligns with civic nationalism, the belief that national policy should primarily serve the citizens of the nation-state.

- Citizenship over global interests
- National sovereignty
- Constitutional rights
- Equal protection under the law for citizens

This position is not inherently racial or ethnic; it is citizenship-based.

2. America First / National Sovereignty

U.S. policies should prioritize American interests over foreign governments, global institutions, or non-citizens.

This aligns with national sovereignty politics, often described as an “America First” approach.

- Border enforcement
- Election integrity
- Domestic economic protection
- Reduced foreign entanglements

3. Nationalism (General Term)

Nationalism simply means prioritizing the nation-state.

However, the term can be interpreted differently depending on tone and framing:

- Civic nationalism — citizenship-based and more inclusive
- Ethnic nationalism — based on ancestry or identity and more exclusionary

Much of modern political debate centers on which version is being expressed.

4. What It Is Not

Supporting a citizens-first policy does not mean:

- Racism

- Isolationism
- Xenophobia

Clarifying the Position

“I believe U.S. policy should prioritize the safety, rights, and economic well-being of American citizens first.”

This position is best described as: Civic nationalist / national sovereignty / citizens-first policy.
