Introduction

The Moral Reframer

Redefines virtue. Renames aggression. Rebrands restriction.

The Economic Alchemist

The Divider

The Escalationist

Pushes every tension slightly further. Ensures resolution remains just out of reach.

Embeds quietly within institutions, builds trust over time, maps internal fault lines, and waits patiently to shift outcomes from within.
