The claim is that this term has been "coined by the right," yet the idea of "Heritage Americans" is not a new concept. We have been referred to by many names since America's founding, including Colonials, settlers, and Old-Fashioned Americans.

However, attacks on Heritage Americans and our culture are relatively new, becoming especially prominent around 2019, though similar political confrontations existed earlier. Praise to our fathers for fighting for American rights and staying the course. The fact that we

have been repeatedly pushed into a defensive position says a great deal about the "new normal."

They have made it clear that they are actively aiming to erase American culture, history, heritage, and sadly, even our population. Angry is not a word that fully captures how we feel. For now, let's simply call it what it is and become more comfortable with the term: Cold War.

A Cold War is a prolonged state of conflict and competition between states, major political blocs, or pacts that falls short of direct, large-scale military war. Instead of conventional battles between armies, a Cold War is typically characterized by a combination of:

- Political and ideological competition.
- Economic pressure, sanctions, or trade competition.
- Intelligence operations and espionage.
- Cyber operations and information campaigns.
- Propaganda and influence operations.
- Competition for allies and international influence.
- Proxy conflicts fought indirectly through other groups or countries.
- Strategic military deterrence, guerrilla warfare, and arms competition.

The classic example is the Cold War between the United States and the Soviet Union from roughly 1947 to 1991. Although there were proxy wars and many periods of tension, the two superpowers did not fight a direct, full-scale war against one another.

Analysts and officials have described strategic competition involving the United States, Russia, and China as exhibiting characteristics of a modern "Cold War." At this time, the United States also faces an internal and recognized rivalry that favors strategic competition involving the United States, foreign actors, and other countries such as Russia and China. These experiences exhibit characteristics commonly associated as a "Cold War."

We recognize these experiences as constituting a full scale Cold War.
