The Truth:

The truth is that White Americans have constantly been placed “beneath” in rights initiatives, and now more than ever White Americans, our military, and our public servants are targeted. This is not a theory, nor is it an argument that can be contested. This targeting is highly visible and experienced.

Regardless of pro-Black organizations which actively critique and reframe reality, reality stands.

Racism is racism. Where White Americans are repeatedly marginalized and disempowered in the rights advocacy arena, and activists have never been more estranged from the common shared values of the United States, many now vehemently supporting extremism, including anarchy, arson, and violence. I advise, as a victim and a witness, that Americans forego new-fashioned activism, leave these harmful activist cultures behind, both for the mind and for our society, and consider what it means to be self-autonomous, self-dignified, and self-secured: to advocate for human safety above all else.

Instead, join the humanitarian movement, which supports each individual, their rights, their freedoms, and their successes.

No human being deserves more access than the next, but in a free society it is important that choice above all remains. Where there still exist Black universities, and where there are many cities in the United States in which Whites are the minority, I move to conclude my research as a lifetime activist, a concerned citizen, a wartime researcher, and a peace advocate that while there is, of course, a place for Black activism, it should never come at the cost of White humanity.

My final position is that I no longer support the rights arena, not as it falls, but rather I support the United States for which it stands. There has been far too much corruption, cronyism, and enemy infiltration, and the systems activists work to dismantle or harm are the very systems that we require.

We can acknowledge racism against Black people while simultaneously acknowledging the realities of racism against White people.

In a world where Whites are becoming a global minority and there is an increasing push for globalization, these realities could not be more real. Furthermore, the history of White slavery should not be ignored, nor should the presence of modern White slavery.

The voices of our past who cried out for these realities to be acknowledged must be heard. White humanity is not up for debate. If one can suffer, the other can too.

The goal should be to reduce human suffering, never to increase it. This is why I support humanitarianism and the end of violent race activism.
