

NLG. *I thought I had unsubscribed.*

“Abolish prisons.

Abolish the police.

Abolish immigration enforcement.”

Call it justice.

NLG does not seek campus dialogue. The effort centers on radical and extremist indoctrination of college students who are still in their formative academic years. Political fires are ignited and sustained. The rhetoric remains fixed in an abstract language of “rights,” while the broader consequences remain unaddressed.

*The primary issue is time and truth. The process of discovery takes years. Americans remain in the dark about who, when, where, what, and why **Americans are being targeted by immigrants**. Evidence continues to accumulate. Public attention is redirected toward dismantling enforcement rather than strengthening lawful protections. They light the fires, and they continue to move in the **opposite** direction of where our country needs to go.*

The movement expands mass migration while discouraging national continuity and cultural preservation. Legal and moral boundaries are blurred in ways that weaken enforcement against trafficking, smuggling, and exploitation. Abnormal conditions are reframed as an accepted standard.

- 1. Activism networks actively expand mass migration. Population growth through migration is encouraged while Americans are discouraged from sustaining their own families. Humanity appears selectively extended to outsiders who align with foreign political fronts.*
- 2. Lines of normalcy are blurred in ways that allow trafficking and exploitation to reproduce.*
- 3. Americans, especially White Americans, are increasingly described as obstacles within their own nation.*
- 4. Eliminating prisons and immigration enforcement removes barriers that restrain traffickers, smugglers, rapists, and organized criminal actors. Political infiltrators, paramilitaries, and foreign enemies benefit when enforcement is weakened.*
- 5. The movement itself operates through migration as a structural strategy.*
- 6. Suppression of Americans, our culture, our heritage, and our voice occurs through shadow banning, removal from political positions of power, muffling of truth, and replacement with a constructed “new normal.”*
- 7. Activists generate spectacle and intensity, yet avoid sustained engagement with legal and societal consequences. Serious policy requires disciplined analysis, historical awareness, and measurable outcomes. Emotional mobilization without responsibility undermines credibility.*

8. *Civil rights protections extend to all humanity, including citizens, families, and victims of crime. Civil rights law secures equal protection and due process under the Constitution. It operates alongside criminal statutes that **safeguard children and communities**.*
9. *Provocative slogans such as “abolish ICE” and “abolish police” generate outrage and attention. Governance requires statutory frameworks, enforceable standards, and constitutional limits. Public safety systems exist because societies require lawful intervention when harm occurs. At this time in history, activists are contributing to societal instability.*
10. *Responsible activism strengthens institutions through accountability and lawful reform. It respects constitutional structure, separation of powers, and public safety. Targeting college aged students with absolutist ideology during formative years shapes future legal professionals around slogans rather than doctrine, precedent, and statutory interpretation.*

The issue is the active role of the National Lawyers Guild in promoting abolitionist ideology to college students under the banner of legal education.

When trained legal professionals advance the dismantling of prisons, law enforcement, and immigration enforcement, they shape the legal worldview of future attorneys. This influence carries professional responsibility. It is politics masquerading as strength, yet it is cruel, unintelligent, and deceitful politics.

Ending modern slavery and dismantling human trafficking networks requires enforcement mechanisms that investigate traffickers, prosecute smugglers, and incarcerate violent offenders. Removing those mechanisms alters the balance of power in favor of criminal actors. Is this the goal of the political actors within NLG?

NLG’s activism carries legal and societal consequences.

Lawful enforcement protects victims and preserves order. *The rule of law depends upon accountability. A justice system functions through investigation, prosecution, and adjudication. Lawyers, of all people, should understand this.*

More ICE. End sanctuary cities. Protect American communities.

The Constitution protects advocacy. It does not shield ideology from scrutiny. Organizations that influence future members of the bar bear responsibility for the real world implications of their positions.

Legal education should strengthen respect for constitutional structure, separation of powers, and public safety. It should reinforce institutional accountability.

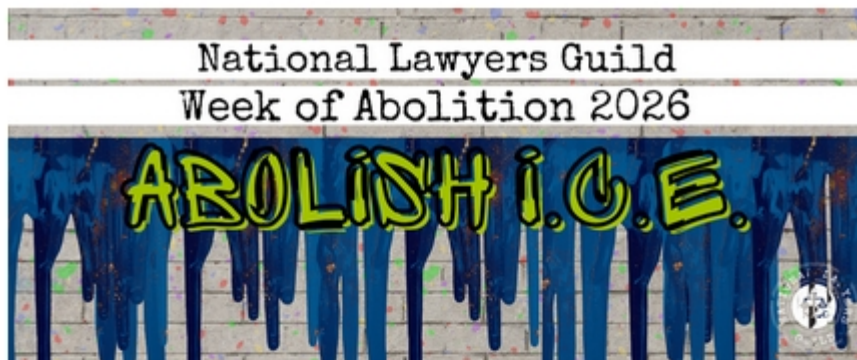
Reform is legitimate. Abolition of accountability is not.
