

WW3-4 Pipeline

Cartel → Territory → Domestic & Foreign Guerrilla Warfare → WW3 → Foreign Enemy Pipeline

The war begins with **transnational criminal organizations and cartels** operating across borders. These organizations can develop trafficking routes, financial networks, weapons channels, communications systems, and logistical infrastructure. When criminal organizations expand their influence into specific geographic areas, the issue can develop beyond criminal activity and become a question of **territorial control**.

Territory can become strategically important because control over geographic areas, border regions, transportation corridors, ports, communities, or other infrastructure can provide access to resources and movement. Where government authority is weakened or contested, criminal organizations, militias, insurgent groups, or other armed organizations may compete for territorial influence. This can create conditions in which organized crime and armed conflict begin to overlap.

The next stage is **domestic guerrilla warfare**, where an armed group operating within a country uses irregular warfare against a government, military, police force, rival organization, or competing territorial authority. Prolonged domestic conflict can weaken institutions, displace populations, disrupt commerce, and create additional opportunities for criminal networks to operate.

The conflict can then acquire a **foreign dimension** when outside governments, intelligence organizations, military organizations, criminal networks, or other foreign actors provide money, weapons, training, intelligence, communications, personnel, or logistical support to an armed group. This creates the possibility of **foreign-supported guerrilla warfare or proxy warfare**, in which a domestic conflict becomes connected to a larger international struggle.

Foreign Enemy Pipeline

The **Foreign Enemy Pipeline** represents the final stage, in which existing criminal, territorial, political, military, or guerrilla networks could potentially be exploited by a foreign adversary. The potential pipeline could involve the movement of **money, weapons, personnel, intelligence, technology, propaganda, communications, or other resources** through interconnected networks.

This understanding identifies an escalation pathway in which **transnational crime, territorial competition, domestic insurgency, foreign-supported guerrilla warfare, proxy conflict, and international confrontation** can interact and potentially amplify one another.
