

Shadowbanning on LinkedIn?

LinkedIn is owned by Microsoft, which acquired the company in 2016 for \$26.2 billion.

LinkedIn, the world's largest professional networking platform, was founded in December 2002 by Reid Hoffman and a team of co-founders that included Allen Blue, Eric Ly, Konstantin Guericke, and Jean-Luc Vaillant. The platform officially launched in May 2003, grew rapidly to millions of users, and became a publicly traded company in 2011 under the ticker symbol **LNKD**.

In June 2016, Microsoft announced its acquisition of LinkedIn in an all-cash transaction valued at **\$26.2 billion**. The acquisition was completed in December 2016, making LinkedIn a wholly owned subsidiary of Microsoft. Following the acquisition, LinkedIn retained its brand identity and operational independence while benefiting from Microsoft's resources and integration with products such as Office 365, Outlook, and Dynamics 365.

Since the acquisition, LinkedIn has continued to operate under its own leadership. Ryan Roslansky has served as Chief Executive Officer since 2020, succeeding Jeff Weiner. During this period, the platform has expanded services such as LinkedIn Learning, Sales Navigator, and Premium subscriptions, while incorporating Microsoft's artificial intelligence and productivity technologies to enhance the user experience.
