The American people deserve to understand the security consequences of policies presented under the language of “peace,” “rights,” or “demilitarization.” We must examine the actual policies, funding, networks, and consequences. We must also examine what these policies encourage, enable, and ultimately produce.

Our national security, defense institutions, military personnel, veterans, and public servants should not be treated as bargaining chips. Any movement or organization advocating policies that could materially undermine public safety or national security should face serious scrutiny, transparency, and accountability. The American people have a right to demand answers when their safety and security are being placed at risk.

They must be held accountable. If organizations are found to be acting against the safety, security, sovereignty, or interests of the American people, they should face appropriate consequences. These consequences could include investigation, loss of public funding, financial and institutional scrutiny, public accountability, boycotts, and permanent dissolution or abolition.

We should not allow political language to be weaponized selectively. If terms such as “defund,” “abolish,” “demilitarize,” “disarm,” or “dismantle” can be applied to American institutions, then the American people have every right to demand the same standards of scrutiny and accountability for organizations whose policies or activities threaten national security or public safety. Political movements should be judged by their actions, their policies, and their consequences rather than by the labels they choose for themselves.

They use intimidation, retaliation, and political violence. No organization is above the American people or the law, and no institution should be immune from accountability. The safety and security of the American people must remain paramount, and we must meet the war where it is.

The Hard Truth

It is all good until the consequences become catastrophic for the American people. We should look beyond political labels and examine what is actually being funded, encouraged, and enabled. If an organization or campaign presents itself as supporting “demilitarization” as “false peace,” we should ask whether its policies genuinely reduce violence or whether they simply shift the battlefield, change the actors supplying weapons, or facilitate other forms of conflict, including proxy, hybrid, or guerrilla warfare.

If the objective is truly peace, then the priorities should be de escalation, diplomacy, civilian protection, secure borders, and an end to warfare. There is no excuse for radical and magical ideology becoming actual national security policy. We do not

need unicorns running our borders during times of war, this is not diplomacy, it is national suicide.

Their goals are not all genuine, either, as we have come to realize. It is a Trojan Horse. We must be willing to examine what is behind the rhetoric and determine whether the policies being promoted actually serve peace, security, and the interests of the American people, because in many modern cases, they do not, far from it.

We should be able to have an honest debate about immigration policy without witnessing the military being relentlessly targeted and harmed. The United States has never seen a more disturbing show of violence from “Abolish” protestors. We must profess, take a break from the activism trance, because we are sick of the clown show in our streets.

Policies involving mass migration can have profound consequences for housing, employment, public services, national security, social cohesion, and the character of communities. These consequences deserve serious public scrutiny. Yet where are activists when Americans are living in homeless encampments and suffering in addiction and dying from drug wars, exploiting money from taxpayers, of course?

Our military, veterans, and public servants should not be treated as bargaining chips. They serve the nation, protect Americans, and carry enormous burdens on behalf of the public. Their safety and institutional integrity are not up for grabs.

Yet activists have grabbed, doxxed, targeted, stalked, assaulted, and even murdered our public servants. Every 1.9 days a public

servant is killed in the line of duty, and that is what they call “peace?” We should be able to condemn violence, intimidation, harassment, and attacks against public servants regardless of who commits them or what political “justification” is offered. The cost has been severe.

Modern left wing political activism has contributed to the worst slavery catastrophe the United States has ever faced. The American people deserve to know what is actually happening and who is truly responsible for the consequences of open borders, human smuggling, and modern slavery. These consequences must be confronted honestly.

If an organization advocates policies that undermine national security, encourage unlawful activity, or perpetuate human exploitation, then we should demand transparency, investigate the evidence, and hold the organization criminally accountable. These questions should be pursued seriously and without retreat. The American people deserve to know the truth.

We should not accept the normalization of warfare, exploitation, smuggling, or human suffering, regardless of who benefits from it or what language is used to justify it. Human life should not become an instrument of political strategy. No political movement should be allowed to hide the consequences of its policies behind language that makes those consequences sound harmless, because I repeat, it is a Trojan Horse.

America needs policies that put the safety of its people first. We need peace through diplomacy, secure immigration and borders, protection of civilians, respect for those who serve, and accountability for organizations whose actions genuinely

threaten public safety. We need policies that protect human life and preserve the security and stability of the nation.

Supporting our US military is not a policy that is up for debate. The American people deserve a serious conversation about national security, immigration, and peace, and they deserve policies that actually protect them. They do not deserve destabilization policies that support enemy benefactors.

No military servant should be abolished, but I can tell you what organizations really should be “dismantled,” in the grand scheme of things. Pro immigration organizations which are responsible for massive movements behind the deaths of Americans because of open borders and poor policies that treat American safety as if it does not matter. American life must be valued. Our military servants have rescued hundreds of thousands of children, yet where is the conversation about them? We are in active combat against the enemy, foreign and domestic.

We can see which side of the war they are on, and this much is clear. This was never a debate, yet these organizations manipulated the public through information warfare, blame shifting, gaslighting, and other harms. The American people deserve to understand the full scope of these activities and the consequences they have had for our national security.

This is not about immigrant rights. It is about Democratic and foreign power, and they are willing to destroy and sabotage the American nation in order to obtain it. They are even willing to fully replace the American population in order to “diversify” or completely alter its race, religion, culture, and economy, while

giving the forces behind modern slavery, genocide, holocaust, and war a pretty slogan or name.

“Abolish ICE” was a tweet, not a national security policy. These groups were in for a severe reality check, with some now in prison and facing up to 100 years after targeting our public servants. They became enemies and terrorists, they stalked us, shot at us, and bombed us. So much for “peace-talks.” They are not on the side of the American people.

Remove our borders, defund the military, and defund the police. These are messages from activists who either know nothing about national security or are actively committing treason and harming Americans by supporting global wars. They are an extremely dangerous movement, and I am calling on all to consider what it means to “abolish” and “boycott” them instead.

End the war on Americans and our public servants. “Defund” socialism, communism, instrumental migration, and the war on our borders. We should prioritize policies that protect American communities, public servants, military personnel, veterans, and civilians. American safety and security is not negotiable!

Wars overseas are fairly simple policy. Stop aiding the foreign enemy. It is time to get on pace with reality.
