Time to adjust our eyes to recognize White Racism and not only call it out, but penalize it, just like any other form of racism:

This image highlights a growing problem in the United States, the use of blame-shifting and derogatory racist labels to silence Americans who speak up for American values.

Increasingly, individuals who are new to this country, or who align with activist subcultures, respond to disagreement by attacking identity rather than engaging in discussion. White Americans, in particular, are often targeted with demeaning, racist labels such as “Karen” when they assert boundaries, raise concerns, or express healthy, historic American values.

This blame-shifting tactic reframes healthy American expression as racism and shifts blame away from inappropriate foreign flag raising. These experiences can be described as foreign intimidation of the American people.

This pattern reflects broader psychological and social warfare, what I refer to as the modern BLAMESOVJF+ war, which aims to divide, demoralize, and delegitimize Americans within their own country. The goal may not be destabilization, but this is what is happening.

Public shaming, racialized insults, and identity-based dismissal of Americans defending their homefront values should not be normalized or tolerated in our society.
