## A Public Casework Project by D. Cowdrey

## **Project Overview**

**Armor Up** is a public casework project in which **Dannielle** shares personal experiences of victimization (without naming others or disclosing confidential information) to illuminate why **boundaries matter** and why communities must respond to very real threats of harm.

These were not minor incidents—they were **severe**. By bringing her own story forward, Dannielle demonstrates that advocacy is not only **professional**, but also **personal**. *Armor Up* is about transforming lived experience into strength—and using that strength to stand with clients, protect their dignity, and ensure their voices are heard.

## **Casework Report**

Major Case: Armor Up

**Subject:** Dannielle's Massage Therapy Practice – *Professional Harm and Boundary Violations* 

#### **Background**

Dannielle operated a self-managed **massage therapy practice**, structured as an LLC, with over **\$30,000 in assets** (equipment, supplies, and investments), in addition to the intangible value of her education, marketing, and skill development.

The practice was designed to provide a **safe**, **private**, **and professional environment** for the benefit of clients. Instead, four primary issues arose that placed the practice, its assets, and the practitioner at risk. These issues form the basis of the case **Armor Up**.

#### **Major Issues**

## 1. Fire and Safety Risks (Arson)

- **Incident:** Dannielle's belongings were set on fire in her practice space.
- **Response:** Office denied accountability, claiming a "young client" was responsible and citing confidentiality to avoid disclosure.
- Risk Assessment: Serious threat to practitioner safety, client safety, and property value.

• **Key Finding:** Safety was disregarded, and transparency was intentionally withheld.

#### 2. Violation of Professional Boundaries

- **Policy Imposed:** Dannielle was not permitted to lock her practice doors, despite the need for privacy and protection of valuable belongings.
- **Violations:** Unauthorized use of her treatment room, including an incident where someone slept on her massage table.
- **Risk Assessment:** Breach of privacy, professional ethics, and liability standards.
- **Key Finding:** Practitioner autonomy and client confidentiality were undermined.

## 3. Undermining and Age Discrimination (Ageism)

- **Behavior:** A co-practitioner imposed excessive cleaning rules on Dannielle despite her meticulous care of the space.
- False Claims: Allegations that she was "not clean," despite consistent diligence before and after each session.
- **Witnesses:** Warned Dannielle of breached trust, boundary violations, and misuse of her professional space.
- **Risk Assessment:** Targeting of practitioner's reputation and credibility.
- **Key Finding:** Professional authority was deliberately undermined, reflecting control tactics and discriminatory behavior.

#### 4. Loss of Assets, Value, and Dignity

- **Asset Risk:** Over \$30,000 in tangible value jeopardized, along with years of educational and professional investment.
- **Intangible Harm:** Damage to dignity, autonomy, and professional identity through smear campaigns and unsafe conditions.
- **Risk Assessment:** Economic and reputational loss compounded by emotional harm.
- **Key Finding:** This pattern reflected manipulation, not collaboration—a systematic removal of autonomy.

## **Case Conclusion: Armor Up**

The case demonstrates a **pattern of power-seeking and manipulation** in which safety, respect, and truth were systematically denied.

When professional dignity is stripped away, harm escalates—from false accusations to arson.

## "Armoring up" became Dannielle's chosen response:

- Protection of Boundaries: Safety and professional autonomy are non-negotiable.
- **Preservation of Dignity:** Refusing to let others define professionalism through smears or control.
- Strength and Vigilance: Recognizing that certain critiques are not rooted in care, but in domination.

By moving into a new office where safety and respect were prioritized, Dannielle demonstrated that *Armor Up* is not about hostility—it is about **resilience**, **self-respect**, **and survival** in the face of systemic disregard.

## **Application of Armor Up to Client Casework**

### 1. Safety as a Baseline

- Lesson: When safety is compromised (e.g., arson, lack of locks), everything else becomes secondary.
- Client Application: Safety—physical, emotional, and financial—is always assessed first. Clients' spaces and rights must be secured before higher-level advocacy begins.

### 2. Respect for Autonomy

- Lesson: Being denied the right to lock a door or set boundaries erodes autonomy and trust.
- Client Application: Clients must have the right to self-determination, free from manipulation or unsafe conditions. Advocacy includes ensuring clients retain autonomy and consent.

## 3. Recognizing Power and Control Tactics

- Lesson: False accusations, excessive criticism, and control rules were tools of domination.
- Client Application: When clients report conflict or systemic barriers, Dannielle investigates whether these are **power tactics**—and reframes the narrative to restore client dignity and truth.

## 4. Valuing Assets and Dignity

- Lesson: Financial loss was significant, but the true injury was to dignity and identity.
- Client Application: Advocacy addresses both tangible (assets, employment, access) and intangible (dignity, safety, respect) forms of harm.

## 5. Armoring Up in Advocacy

- Lesson: Resilience is not aggression—it's protection through boundaries, truth-telling, and safe exits.
- Client Application: Dannielle teaches clients to:
  - Name harms without internalizing blame.
  - Identify when criticism is a tool of control.
  - Build protective strategies to safeguard dignity, safety, and value.

### **Representation Outcome**

By integrating Armor Up into her advocacy framework, Dannielle:

- Applies trauma-aware, boundary-conscious methods to every client's case.
- Frames client harms within broader patterns of systemic power and control.
- **Models resilience**, showing that while environments can strip dignity, individuals can reclaim it through protection and truth.

#### **Potential Personal Claim**

If pursued in court, Dannielle's **potential claim value** could range from \$50,000 to several hundred thousand dollars, based on asset loss, professional harm, and reputational damages.

However, for Dannielle, the true value of *Armor Up* lies not in compensation but in **empowerment**—the act of standing strong, transforming pain into purpose, and ensuring that every client learns how to armor up for their own protection and dignity.

Case Summary – Veteran Student Pilot Advocacy

## Background

Following her discovery of a passion for aviation through a positive mentorship experience with an instructor friend, **Dannielle** chose to pursue her flight education formally.

Encouraged by her early success and inspired journal entries documenting growth, she enrolled at a **local university flight program**—a decision grounded in both passion and practicality.

However, her experience revealed systemic issues impacting veteran students, including potential GI Bill misuse, favoritism, and administrative barriers that obstructed progress and dignity in her pursuit of certification.

## **Key Issues**

## 1. Leadership Changes and Favoritism

- The original, supportive program director left, and a **new director implemented biased and inconsistent practices.**
- Examples included **selective extra credit opportunities** and dismissal of professional courtesies, leaving Dannielle and others feeling **excluded and undervalued.**
- This bias extended across classroom and administrative interactions, creating a **climate of inequity and distrust.**

#### **Key Finding:**

Institutional favoritism eroded fairness, morale, and equal educational opportunity.

## 2. Flight Instruction Barriers and Administrative Obstacles

- A new instructor (immigrant) refused to fly with Dannielle, citing an alleged ID issue—despite her valid U.S. military retiree ID.
- Ongoing aircraft malfunctions, scheduling conflicts, and lack of instructor continuity delayed training progress for multiple students, particularly veterans.
- Despite long **weekend drives in harsh winter weather**, Dannielle persisted, showing resilience in the face of systemic obstruction.

## **Key Finding:**

Barriers appeared targeted and institutional, creating unequal access to completion and certification.

#### 3. Coercion and Intimidation

- Dannielle was **pressured to sign a rights waiver** in a private meeting as a condition for continuing into the next semester.
- She faced **verbal attacks and false allegations**, including fabricated claims of drug use—circulated by the director and observed by a supportive instructor.
- The environment became **psychologically unsafe**, leading to significant stress and emotional harm.

## **Key Finding:**

Coercive tactics and defamatory claims were used to suppress complaints and force compliance.

#### 4. Financial Harm and Potential GI Bill Misuse

- The university allegedly **collected two semesters of GI Bill funds** while Dannielle attended only one.
- Access to transcripts and financial documentation was obstructed by a \$500 administrative fee.
- Investigations were opened through the **Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)**; however, restitution remains unresolved.
- Evidence suggests a possible **pattern of GI Bill mismanagement** impacting multiple veteran students.

## **Key Finding:**

Potential financial exploitation of veterans and misuse of federal education benefits.

#### 5. Wider Impact on Veteran Students

- Other veterans faced similar patterns of **funding threats**, **training delays**, and **psychological pressure**.
- One veteran student tragically **died by suicide**, highlighting the urgency and severity of the environment's effects.

#### **Key Finding:**

The institution's failures created systemic harm that extended far beyond individual students, affecting veteran well-being on a structural level.

#### **Action Taken**

- Dannielle withdrew from the program to protect her safety, dignity, and mental health.
- She reported concerns to the VA, triggering inquiries into GI Bill misuse and discriminatory practices.
- She **documented all experiences**, both for her own protection and as advocacy evidence for other veterans navigating similar injustices.

#### **Result:**

The experience became the foundation for advocacy reform within the *Armor Up* campaign—bridging personal testimony and systemic awareness.

### Lessons and Advocacy Takeaways (Armor Up)

#### 1. Safety and Dignity First

Never compromise personal well-being to satisfy institutional pressure.

#### 2. Recognize Manipulation

Bias, favoritism, and coercion are not mere workplace conflicts—they are tools of control and suppression.

## 3. Document and Report

Accurate records, journals, and correspondence are critical for addressing systemic abuse.

### 4. Empowerment Through Boundaries

Walking away from harm is not failure—it is protection, strategy, and self-respect.

### 5. Veteran Advocacy and Oversight

Stronger accountability measures are needed to monitor schools receiving VA education funding.

Case Summary – Protection from Stalking, Coercion, and Non-Consensual Filming By D. Cowdrey

### **Background**

Dannielle endured a prolonged period of **targeted abuse** by an individual exhibiting **manipulative**, **coercive**, **and predatory behaviors**.

The perpetrator—a Russian first-born immigrant male—engaged in a sustained pattern of stalking, psychological manipulation, non-consensual recording, financial exploitation, and intimidation that spanned multiple locations and contexts.

This pattern of abuse included:

- Coerced filming and digital exploitation
- · Sleep deprivation and emotional control
- Repeated violations of privacy and personal boundaries

Through this experience, Dannielle identified critical gaps in community protection and accountability—issues she now addresses directly through the **Armor Up Victim Advocacy Campaign.** 

## **Key Patterns of Abuse**

### 1. Non-Consensual Recording & Trauma Voyeurism

- Private and intimate moments were **secretly recorded** without consent.
- The content was **used for intimidation and control**, creating an ongoing threat of exposure.

- Repeated attempts to extract money, gifts, and personal resources from Dannielle.
- Theft of ideas, creative works, and personal experiences for the perpetrator's self-promotion.

 Two incidents in which she was coerced to live with him, only to be abandoned and left homeless within days.

## **Key Finding:**

Financial and intellectual theft are extensions of abuse—exploiting vulnerability for personal gain.

#### 5. Community Risk

- The perpetrator's behavior posed **ongoing risks to other women**, particularly within shared **social and activist circles.**
- Patterns of **grooming, coercion,** and **digital manipulation** suggest potential escalation without accountability or intervention.

#### **Key Finding:**

Individual abusers can create community-wide harm; awareness and intervention are public safety responsibilities.

### **Impact on Victim**

- Severe emotional distress and post-traumatic symptoms.
- Physical injury linked to coercive encounters.
- Homelessness and financial instability caused by manipulation and abandonment.
- **Professional disruption** due to intimidation and social interference.
- Loss of privacy and peace, resulting in long-term vigilance and retraumatization.

### **Key Finding:**

The cumulative impact extended beyond personal harm, affecting livelihood, trust, and community engagement.

## Armor Up Campaign – Privacy, False Arrests, and Doxxing

Subject: Digital Exploitation and the Right to Dignity

#### **Background**

As a teenager, Dannielle attended a party where she was wrongfully arrested under the claim of possessing an "open container." In truth, she held no such item. Rather than flee, she chose integrity—approaching the officer calmly and cooperating.

The charge was baseless and never pursued, yet the damage was done. The arrest record was published online, spreading across search engines and news aggregators, violating her privacy and reputation.

Years later, the digital shadow of that false arrest resurfaced—this time affecting not only Dannielle but a large group of peers from the same high school. Their teenage arrests, most of them unfounded or dismissed, were publicly displayed, endangering careers, relationships, and personal dignity.

#### **Action Taken**

Recognizing the injustice, Dannielle acted swiftly. She issued a formal **cease-and-desist letter** to the publishing agency responsible for hosting the records. Within **12 hours**, the listings were taken down.

## Armor Up Campaign - Concert Assault and Wrongful Arrest

## **Background**

At a live concert where she held **valid VIP passes and authorization**, Dannielle was initially welcomed by security and permitted near the front of the stage. However, later in the event, a different set of officers arrived and—without warning—accused her of **trespassing**. Despite calmly explaining her credentials and cooperation, the situation escalated when she objected to the officer's growing aggression.

What followed was an act of violence and humiliation at the hands of law enforcement.

## **Incident Summary**

Dannielle was **grabbed so violently that she lost consciousness**, then carried away and transported against her will. Once in custody, she endured **severe abuse and degradation**:

- Dragged and forcibly stripped, denied her privacy and dignity.

The point: Whenever language is used to degrade, dehumanize, or target someone because of their race or identity, it is racism — and it may constitute hate speech.

#### Why It Matters

Calling out racism is **not about politics** — it's about **protecting people and communities**. Hate thrives when ignored. It festers, divides, and can escalate into **violence** — something far too many have witnessed and suffered in modern times.

## A Reminder on Common Decency

Respect and kindness build **strong communities**. Today, I enjoyed connecting with people of all colors — the Sapote Family — sharing smiles, stories, and mutual respect.

Key point: Respect isn't optional. Online or in person, aggression and racism are not "free speech" when they cross into hate or harassment.

White people, like myself, are often **criticized**, **dismissed**, **or even abused** for standing against racism directed at us — but this must change.

## Safety, Identity, and Dignity

#### Reflections on Returning to the South and Navigating Polarizing Anti-White Movements

Since returning to the United States from Puerto Rico, I have experienced a series of distressing events that have profoundly affected my sense of **safety and belonging**.

In just the last few years, I have:

- Been stalked while booking a hotel.
- Been **followed while hiking by scooter bikers**, who observed my vehicle and returned later.
- Nearly been struck by a **scooter biker** on a separate occasion.
- Had my **luggage stolen**, including brand-new work suits, clothes, and keepsakes I had worked hard to acquire.

- Been approached by a pimp and filmed against my will.
- Been **threatened at a store checkout line**, falsely accused of cutting in line, and intimidated by a group claiming they were from New York. Police were called.
- Experienced repeated **microaggressions and psychological intimidation** at multiple stores, including staff mishandling or throwing my belongings.
- Suspected tampering with my drink.

These incidents, some involving people from outside the U.S., left me fearful and disoriented.

In contrast, during my time in Canada, I experienced far less hostility, despite similar societal challenges, such as arson attacks on churches. The scale of violence and intimidation in the U.S. feels uniquely targeted in some instances, particularly toward white Americans.

As a white American woman, I want to acknowledge an often-overlooked truth: **racial or cultural hostility toward white Americans exists**, and it can be deeply painful and isolating. I have witnessed online rhetoric and movements, including "colonizer" or anti-white narratives, growing increasingly hostile.

This statement is not about blame—it is about **truth and healing**. Every person deserves **dignity**, **compassion**, **and respect**, regardless of race, background, or belief.

Our nation's strength lies not in division, but in our shared humanity. Life is too short to fight over color or supremacy. What most people truly seek is **kindness**, **safety**, **and the opportunity to live with peace and purpose**.

To me, being American means **standing up for fairness, respect, and open dialogue**, no matter who we are or where we come from.

This is my call for **safety**, **justice**, **and recognition** of lived experiences that are often dismissed or minimized.

## The Rise, Success, and Impact of Black and Hispanic Organized Crime

## **1** The Rise

In the mid to late 20th century, Black and Hispanic organized crime emerged as earlier syndicates— Italian, Irish, and others—declined. New leadership structures filled this void, developing hierarchies, symbols of allegiance, and codes of silence.

Often beginning as neighborhood networks, these groups eventually expanded into interstate and transnational operations. Their influence grew from street-level activity to business fronts, political access, and even cyber operations. What initially appeared as local gang activity evolved into sophisticated systems capable of laundering money, trafficking drugs and people, and manipulating institutions through intimidation or bribery.



#### The Success

These networks succeeded through organization, adaptability, and discipline. Key strategies included:

- Diversifying income streams: from narcotics to real estate and technology fraud.
- Exploiting community trust: using familiarity and loyalty to recruit, conceal operations, and gaslight those who might expose wrongdoing.
- Maintaining control through fear: silencing others with intimidation, smear campaigns, and accusations of racism or extremism.

• Infiltrating legitimate systems: establishing influence in businesses, social institutions, and political channels.

Some framed themselves as "community protectors" or "providers," masking criminal dominance behind false narratives of honor. Their ability to hide illegality under cultural, familial, or business facades makes their influence particularly dangerous.

Mass organized migrations, sometimes aided by other syndicates—Jewish, Russian, and Chinese helped expand these networks into new hubs of exploitation.

## The Impact

Behind the image of power lies a devastating reality:

- Women and children suffer most: used for leverage, coerced into silence, or drawn into trafficking and exploitation.
- Communities lose safety: corruption replaces moral order.
- Families fracture: fear and coercion silence truth-telling.
- Public trust erodes: neighbors become afraid to report wrongdoing.

The true story of success is not the rise of these groups—it's the courage of those who stand against them: survivors, law enforcement, ministries, and citizens who refuse to normalize organized harm.
