

Union of Saint's and Our Original Journey

Union of Saint's recognizes that there may be other organizations with similar names or ideas. We would like to affirm that our church's experience was original, from the naming process, to the philosophy of achieving freedom, to therapy as our method of healing, and to the use of "US" as part of our identity.

Just as some faith communities describe themselves as the one true church according to their own beliefs, we similarly believe that we are the true Union of Saint's church. We see the spirit of "US" manifesting in many beautiful ways, but we also recognize that original authors are not always quoted or given credit for their work, especially in modern society. We believe that copying ideas without acknowledgment has become too common and reflects a lack of appreciation for the labor, creativity, and love that others invest in their work and organizations.

We know that we are the first Union of Saint's in the United States because we intentionally researched the name before adopting it. As Native Americans, we also know our country well and have noticed that new churches with similar names or philosophies occasionally appear. Our experience was prophetic. It was a spiritual revelation, and it was uniquely our own. For this reason, we believe there is no other church quite like Union of Saint's.

At the same time, we have encountered others whose revelations or prophecies may be remarkably similar. Yet, their experiences remain uniquely theirs. We find this meaningful because it suggests that God works through many people in beautiful and mysterious ways. This is part of the wonder of prophecy.

Even so, we believe it is important to state clearly that our experience was built from the ground up and nurtured through the Spirit. One aspect of the Union of Saint's journey that has been especially meaningful is the amount of synchronicity we discovered along the way.

For example, the idea of building a spiritual chaplaincy began many years ago while I was serving in the military, around 2007. This was long before my later spiritual revelations. What is especially interesting is that the title we chose for our volunteer group was entirely original to us. I even asked a friend for help in choosing between names such as Collective or Alliance. We ultimately chose North Star Alliance. Later, I discovered that the military also has a chaplaincy known as the North Star Alliance.

The same was true with the word Union. Calling our church a union was a completely original expression. Later, I learned that early military chaplaincies were also called unions. The journey was natural, exploratory, and authentic. It was really cool to unfurl the Union of Saints for this reason, it truly reflected who we are and the path of our own spiritual journey.

While we believe it is important to establish clear boundaries and affirm that Union of Saint's follows its own distinct path, and we also recognize that the spirit behind our work cannot truly be copied, it absolutely can be shared. We have been grateful to see our message resonate with many people, and our following has grown in wonderful ways. The experience may be shared by many, but its origin remains our own.

When the time comes for people to seek a spiritual home with Union of Saint's, we hope they will find us here, welcoming them with the same mission of peace that inspired our journey from the very beginning. Still, we honor our originality and very much hope that others will also! Thank you :.)!
