

Hate Crimes Motivated by Anti-White Bias: Fastest-Growing Category of Hate Crime

The truth burns, still we will warn.

Race Reporting: The problem is that the media is very biased. However, my experience, both in person and online, is that the increase in hostility is so significant that it amounts to modern warfare. It generates a very uneasy feeling and reminds me of “clan” behavior that one might have seen during the earlier years of civil conflict within the United States.

The issue has increased with mass immigration and demographic changes. Yet the racism isn’t just hate speech; it is also coming with really horrifying violent crime. The mainstream media is not reporting many of these stories. I am seeing them daily as I have found several new sources that I can rely on for more truthful stories.

Unfortunately, mainstream media is owned by just a few companies, and they are very heavily globalized and left-leaning, as we have researched through our data-combing process. It has been particularly scary reading some of the anti-White news articles, as the names are often unfamiliar: Middle Eastern, Indian, Chinese, Russian, etc. The authors are often not American, and when they are, they are very strongly aligned with left-leaning politics, meaning the author may be writing from a political perspective.

More than just anti-White hate, though, there is often politics assigned to it. For example, it can be anti-White, anti-MAGA, anti-Charlie Kirk, or anti-Trump supporters, meaning they are assigning political beliefs to White hate even when the victim does not have known political affiliation. All of this experience is widely ignored by these same individuals, who are often also involved in left-wing politics, such as activist campaigns in support of other groups.

One also wonders whether those individuals are actually Americans or whether some could be part of Russia’s information campaigns and cyberwar against the West, potentially joined by allies. This experience is not normal in the United States, far from it. It is largely a result of technology.

Today, the experience is not as volatile in person. Because of mass deportations and the subsiding of political “fire” from the beginning of the year, volatility has gone down. For example, even in Arizona, where the demographics are very diverse, there is an overall experience that there is a friendly atmosphere with no major issues. People like to meet others, become friends, get to know each other, and even invite others out to spend time together. There is support for veterans, people are smiling, and overall, there is a very good feeling.

However, the experience was different in January, February, and March. The experience has gotten better, and it is not nearly as hostile. I did find a lot of very anti-White violent and

aggressive experiences in South Tucson, which is predominantly a Hispanic demographic. There was also higher crime in this area. I noticed White targeting, specifically as a White female, by people within the Mexican demographic. There was aggressive and volatile driving, Mexican males who resembled gang or cartel members, along with a generally shady feeling. However, this has subsided. These incidents went down *substantially*.

I reported several incidents while I was here. I was a victim of aggressive driving by a Mexican female who chose to enter my lane aggressively and then proceeded to continue driving. When I stopped my vehicle, my only other option would be to reverse, and I was in the lane first, she proceeded to yell at me and call me Karen. I was staying for several weeks at the hotel and did not recognize the person. I reported her to the hotel manager, and they advised that they also did not recognize her, but if they saw her, they would remove her from the hotel.

I experienced several instances of aggressive driving. I did take the license plate down of several individuals. One day, when I was running, I did have water thrown at me, which I chose to report to the police. We experienced vandalism and dumping on our road shortly after. I also noticed many individuals addicted to hard drugs walking along the road. It started to feel scary.

It almost seemed like a coordinated attack, as shortly after the vandalism and dumping attacks, the homeless encampments developed rapidly. I reported these experiences and also warned some of the residents to be careful when walking at night, as the block's energy was changing very quickly.

There were bikers racing along our road at night, nearly every night, and I chose to report this as well. Many of these issues did get better. Unfortunately, the homeless encampment did not. The town of Tucson neglected this issue and chose to close the ticket. This is an issue that should be litigated with the town of Tucson.

The encampment is hidden in the wash; however, the trash is starting to show closer to the road. I did notice that there were potentially undocumented immigrants walking along the paths where I also saw the heavy drug users. Political signs started to show up around the neighborhood, as well as an "ICE" sign. All of the signs stayed up for months. The ICE sign actually made me feel safer and put my mind at ease. The outside traffic began to subside.

I believe this is a sign that the deportations have offered Arizona a more positive experience, despite the protests and violence arising from some protestors. I think that the protestors also have a lot to answer for at this time, especially regarding their support for cartels, gangs, foreign enemies, and violence against Americans. I look forward to seeing law and policy reform. I fear for Americans after this experience and am sincerely worried about what the left activists are capable of. At this stage, I see a war front, and it is supporting foreign wars, not the United States.

I write from a White Acadian perspective, as I never have before these last several years, during a time when there has been a rapid increase in anti-White racism and hate, including

targeting, attacks, and even murder. Sadly, I believe much of this is underreported and, worse, misconstrued as racism. Protecting oneself is not about politics or racism. The experience is very dark and feels like civil war. We have every right to speak our truth and share the reality of the situation we are facing. Speech suppression and dehumanization of White Americans is unacceptable.

The question remains: Are these racist, hostile forces really Americans, or are they foreign enemies? Americans seem to be getting along better without all of the online noise and without invaders, guerrillas, traffickers, terrorists, and foreign militias creating conflict within our borders. A lot of us are still healing from this and will continue to heal as we continue to witness racial conflict online and through the media.

However, it is safe to say that the deportations of America's number-one enemy, traffickers, are helping America return to normal and to a much safer, healthier state once again. More can be done for places like Philadelphia, San Francisco, Chicago, LA, and other places. We have to beware of not only false media reporting and left media reporting, but also fraud in metrics, polls, and voting.

After all that we have witnessed, the arrests, the fallen servants, and all the work of the men and women safeguarding our nation, one thing is for sure: We are so very thankful for those individuals who selflessly serve their country so that we may be safe. Thank you.
