Proposed Legislation: American Home and Vehicle Ownership Act

Union of Saints

Purpose

To promote public safety, strengthen accountability, preserve housing opportunities for American citizens, and establish clear standards governing home and vehicle ownership.

Section 1. Short Title

This Act shall be known as the **American Home and Vehicle Ownership Act**.

Section 2. Legislative Findings

Congress finds that:

- Home ownership and reliable transportation are fundamental components of economic stability and community development.
- Public safety is advanced through clear ownership records and legal accountability.
- Preserving opportunities for American citizens to acquire homes contributes to long-term community stability.

Section 3. Policy

It shall be the policy of the United States to establish, consistent with the Constitution and applicable federal law, eligibility requirements for home and vehicle ownership as determined by Congress.

Section 4. Public Safety Objectives

The objectives of this Act are to:

- Promote lawful ownership and accountability.
- Reduce fraud and improve ownership verification.
- Strengthen public safety through accurate ownership records.
- Preserve housing opportunities for eligible American citizens.

- Encourage responsible ownership of homes and motor vehicles.

Section 5. Rulemaking

The appropriate federal agencies shall promulgate regulations necessary to implement this Act, consistent with constitutional protections and all applicable federal laws.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Act shall take effect on a date established by Congress following enactment.
