ASK (Anti State Klan) is a term used in this document to describe individuals or groups that engage in anti-government extremism or unlawful conduct directed against public institutions and public servants. It is offered as an educational document for discussing behaviors that undermine public safety and the rule of law.

This document distinguishes between peaceful activism, which is protected in democratic societies, and unlawful conduct involving violence, intimidation, harassment, or criminal activity. Peaceful advocacy and disagreement with government policy are legitimate forms of community participation. However, violence and criminal conduct directed toward public servants or the public are fundamentally different from lawful political expression and may contribute to civil conflict or even civil war.

Behaviors Examined

The ASK model examines conduct such as:

- Violence or assaults against members of the military.
- Violence or assaults against law enforcement officers.
- Violence or assaults against Border Patrol personnel and other public servants.
- Throwing fireworks, explosives, or other dangerous objects at officers or emergency responders.
- Organized street takeovers that place the public at risk.
- Doxxing military personnel, law enforcement officers, or other public servants to facilitate intimidation or harassment.
- Threats, stalking, or targeted harassment of public officials and their families.
- Destruction of government or private property.
- Interference with lawful public safety operations.
- Smuggling or other criminal enterprises that undermine public safety.
- Material support for criminal organizations where prohibited by law.
- Attempts to intimidate judges, prosecutors, jurors, witnesses, or government employees.

- Violence or threats intended to influence government decisions or public policy.
- Political trafficking, blackmail, or surveillance.
- Looting, theft, or organized crime.
- Efforts to reduce criminal penalties in ways that increase risks to public safety.
- Support for foreign enemies.

Public Policy Discussions

This model also examines public policy debates surrounding policing, immigration enforcement, criminal sentencing, incarceration, and public safety. Individuals and organizations may lawfully advocate for changes to these policies through peaceful and constitutional means.

This document distinguishes lawful advocacy from unlawful conduct involving violence, intimidation, coercion, or criminal acts directed toward individuals or public institutions.

Educational Conclusion

The purpose of this document and educational model about the now-termed **"Anti-State Klan"** is to encourage discussion about conduct that undermines public safety and the rule of law.
