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Rubio orders deportation of Kuwaiti permanent resident who smeared Americans as his 'enemy' and praised terrorism

Praised Terrorism

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A Kuwaiti man who became a lawful permanent resident of the United States is being booted by the State Department due to anti-American views, according to a new report.

Tareq Alkhudari entered the U.S. in 2014 to study at San Jose State University and received a green card in 2024, but is now in federal custody, according to the [Daily Wire](#).



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The report said Secretary of State Marco Rubio terminated Alkhudari's legal status.

Alkhudari's social media accounts express anti-American opinions and pro-Hamas positions.

For example, he supported what he called the "Al-Aqsa Flood," which was the code name Hamas gave to its terrorist attack on Israel on Oct. 7, 2023.

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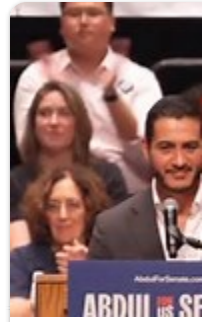
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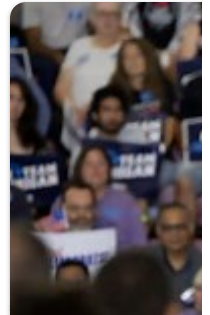
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Fauci discussed COVID mRNA vaccine concerns for pregnant women in text chain released by Senate committee

The exchange involved Fauci, then-Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Director [Dr. Rochelle Walensky](#) and Dr. Vivek Murthy, who would later become former President Joe Biden's surgeon general.

Fauci said, because many people experience significant cytokine-related symptoms and fever after a second dose, that reaction "theoretically could be associated with miscarriage in the 1st trimester," according to the messages shown on page two of documents released Monday by Sens. Ron Johnson, R-Wis., and Rand Paul, R-Ky.

"The text chain released today could have an immediate impact [on] public health and the principle of informed consent," Johnson's press release read.

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
